

From Pastor Travis's Study



Sisters and Brothers,

Grace to you and peace in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ whose birth we are about ready to celebrate.

I love Christmas time. I love the gathering of families around Christmas trees, and the movies that are full of hope and wonder (NOT Hallmark Christmas movies). I love Christmas Eve worship where all my favorite hymns are sung. I love hearing the story of Jesus being born into a world of chaos with the promise of something better to come.

As I have gotten older, I have found myself becoming more and more like one of my favorite comic characters. I am a huge fan of the Peanuts comic strip and all of the movies. Two of my favorite characters in this comic are Charlie Brown and Linus. Every year at Christmas I find myself becoming more and more like Charlie Brown. I look around and see less and less about the real meaning of Christmas, and more and more about buying this gift or that really expensive item to prove how much I love somebody. More and more I find myself wanting to yell "Can somebody please tell me what Christmas is about?" as Charlie Brown does. Charlie has to go on a search to find the meaning of Christmas. I feel like for many of us, we do have to go on a search for the meaning of Christmas every once in a while.

It is Charlie Brown's friend Linus who comes to his aid to help him begin to find the meaning of Christmas. Linus recites the story of Jesus being born as told by Luke. At the end of his recitation, Linus tells Charlie, this is the meaning of Christmas, referring to Jesus being born. In my search for the meaning of Christmas, I realized how many times I listened to the story of Jesus being born without really listening to it. Then one year something clicked in my head. The miracle of Christmas and the meaning of Christmas is found in the Incarnation. Incarnation is just a fancy theological word that means Christ becoming human. The miracle of Christmas is that God became a person just like me. Jesus was born into a messy world and came to live a messy life, and He died a messy death. All of these things we experience.

Incarnation was something new for the world when Jesus was born. No other ancient god lived like us. The Greek gods lived on Mt. Olympus distant from people. The pharaohs of Egypt were believed to be gods, and they owned slaves and had buildings made in their honor. In Jesus' time, the Roman Emperor was considered a god and he live the most lavish life ever. The gods were nothing like people.

I realized we tell the story of Christ being born year after year because we know what the end of the story is. The end is not His death, but His resurrection and new life that is given to each one of us. We tell the story because we know that our God has lived among us and knows what we go through. God knows our worries and our troubles. God promises to be with us through our troubles.

This Christmas season as we retell the story of the birth of Jesus, let us remember the miracle of the Incarnation and what that means for us. If you find yourself in a Charlie Brown mood, remind yourself of the promise that God is with you in the midst of your search. The meaning of the Incarnation has ended my search for the meaning of Christmas, may it end yours as well.

May God Bless you this Christmas season. May your days be filled with the Joy, Peace, Love, and Hope of God through Christ Jesus. And, May the wonder and miracle of Christmas fill your heart.

Trustees Report

Trustee items in process or completed:

- Lezzer Lumber has been fully paid for the new doors and windows in the parsonage.
- That project, along with our usual expenses, has depleted the general checking account. We will need additional funds to get through the end of the year. Therefore, we will be withdrawing the remaining balance in the fire fund account (approximately \$14,100) and moving it to the general checking account. This means the only funds remaining from the insurance proceeds is the \$100,000 we recently placed in a CD at Mifflinburg Bank.
- The contract for the gas supply in the Parish House expires on December 9. I have been researching rates and will sign at least a 12-month contract, possibly longer, to get a lower rate.
- Susquehanna Fire completed their annual inspection of the fire extinguishers on November 18. All extinguishers passed inspection.
- The paddles which open the exterior handicapped door are not working. Lezzer Commercial Door came out to look at them. The handicapped door was made by Stanley. Because it's a Stanley door, Lezzer's is not able to service it. I will be contacting Stanley for service. We also asked Lezzer's to look at the men's room door, which seems to have shifted and is sticking a bit at the top. Leezer's believes the frame is shifting so they recommend a contractor look at making some repairs.
- In addition to the problems with the men's room door, part of the wall is loose in the north Front Street entrance vestibule. This too will need a contractor to repair. I've contacted Poole Anderson who will be sending someone out to assess the work required.
- Air Tech HVAC will be completing the fall service on the HVAC systems at the church, Parish House, and parsonage on December 11.
- At our most recent Leadership Meeting we discussed the small mutual fund account with Prudential.
 At the end of September the value of the account was \$12,425.93. There are no notes in the files
 about why this separate account exists, or if there are any stipulations on its use. Because we will
 need additional funds for current expenses in early 2025, we decided to close out the account and
 deposit the funds in the general checking account.

Leadership Team Report...

The Team has decided to close out the church's Fire Fund checking account, which has been in existence at Milton Savings Bank ever since our property/casualty insurance proceeds began to come in after the 2019 fire. The remaining balance will be shifted to the General Account, where it will help pay current expenses.

Additionally, Bethany has a relatively small mutual fund account with Prudential that is apparently not earmarked for a particular application, so the Team decided to cash that in at the end of 2024 and put the money to unrestricted general use.

We chose to have a Christmas Eve service at Bethany on Tuesday, December 24 at 3:00 PM, a time of day compatible with the needs of those who abhor driving in the dark.

The gifts of Christmas poinsettias and cookies for our home-bound members will be repeated this season.

Members and regular service attendees will remember the memorial board that was mounted in the rear of the pre-fire Bethany sanctuary – it's still on the premises, and we will affix it to the wall above the mailboxes in the office. The book that went with it, which mostly contained the names of those who donated funds toward the purchase of the former Reliable Furniture building many years ago, is also intact and is kept in the office as well. So, yes, we are preserving all of that history.

The pay rates for 2025 for Bethany's employees have been reviewed and adjusted upward. I will report on that separately as Chair of PSPRC, since the figures are both confidential and mainly of internal interest.

The Team will not meet formally in December. Its next regularly-scheduled gathering will therefore be on Tuesday, January 21, 2025.
