<u>Canned Food Drive</u>-TBLA is appealing to our members for support of the Sabine Council on Aging's canned food drive. We are attempting to help the Council restock their Emergency Food Pantry. Please bring canned goods to the February TBLA Social Meeting to support this worthy cause.

<u>Blood Drive</u>-The Lifeshare Blood Center crew will be at our February 7, 2019 Monthly Membership Social and expect to start receiving donors at 5:30 PM. All persons wishing to donate blood are encouraged to participate.

<u>Board of Directors Actions</u>-The TBLA Board of Directors met on January 15, 2019. Among other business, the following actions were taken:

- 4-H Grant-A \$2,000 Grant was approved for sponsorship of the Sabine Parish 4-H Shooting Sports-Shotgun Discipline Team.
- Furniture Purchase-In recent months, we have not had enough tables and chairs to meet our needs at our Monthly Membership Socials. The Board approved the purchase of four tables and sixteen chairs in the amount of \$900.
- TBLA Website Update-Our current website has served us well for some time, but it does not work well with smartphones and other mobile devices. The simple fact is that many people use such devices to interact with our modern world, and TBLA is part of that world. We acquire members, raise funds and distribute information online daily. Our website needs to be updated; and to that end, the Board approved an expenditure of \$540.
- Florida Largemouth Bass Fingerlings-The Board approved a minimum of \$25,000 for the purchase of bass fingerlings for the coming season. We plan to make these fingerlings available for our members to release into Toledo Bend Reservoir as has been done in the past. Further details will be provided as they become available.

<u>Toledo Bend Lunker Bass Program</u> —Clint Wade of Huntsville, TX caught a 10.84-pound bass on January 12, 2019, bringing the lunker bass total to 17 for the current year. Clint weighed his fish in at Keith's Toledo Bend Tackle.

On January 14, 2019, Cody Pitt of Many, LA brought an 11.49-pound Lunker into Buckeye Landing that upped the Lunker count to 18.

Jonathan Edwards weighed a 10.40-pound fish at Fairmount Store on January 16, 2019. Jonathan's fish is Lunker number 19 for this season. Congratulations guys!

Celebration Set to Kick-off the Bicentennial of Louisiana's No Man's Land

The No Man's Land - Becoming Louisiana Bicentennial Celebration is a collaborative effort between the seven parishes who are historically tied to the geographic area of Louisiana's Final Frontier. Partner members include Desoto Parish Tourist Bureau, Sabine Parish Tourist Commission, Natchitoches Parish Tourist Commission, Vernon Parish Tourism, Beauregard Tourist Commission, Allen Parish Tourist Commission, Lake Charles/Southwest Louisiana CVB and Cane River National Heritage Area.

The kick-off celebration begins on Friday, February 15th with an official opening ceremony at 10AM featuring remarks from Lt. Governor Billy Nungesser. The Louisiana State Fiddle Champion, Clancey Stewart will perform and an authentic No Man's Land lunch will be served after the ceremony. Living historians and reenactors will be on hand to demonstrate life on the Louisiana frontier. Local schools and homeschool groups are invited to participate on this day, to reserve your group spot please contact Cane River National Heritage Area at 318-356-5555.

The celebration continues Saturday, February 16th from 9AM to 4PM with living history demonstrations, music and children's activities. Both event days are free and open to the public.
