



Illinois Veterinary Education & Training (IVET) is a loan program funded by the Illinois Farm Bureau. The program loans up to \$40,000 total to as many as three, veterinary students attending any accredited college of veterinary medicine in the U.S. These students must commit to working in a food animal practice servicing Illinois producers, following graduation.



The IVET Committee may offer students up to \$40,000 in loans, paid over 2-3 years depending on the application timeline.

Loan Specifics:

- Interest begins to accrue upon completion of the student's DVM
- Semi-annual payments begin six months after the student graduates
- The loan is paid back over a five-year period
- Interest rate on the loan is fixed at 2% (two percent) APR
- Students must commit to a food animal practice and work in this field during the life of the loan repayment, and service Illinois livestock producers.
- Loans will be awarded to up to three students, and disbursed in August or September.
- Loan proceeds will be sent directly to the student.
- Substantial interest penalties will apply if the student fails to complete their DVM, or does not enter a food animal practice.
- A \$1,500 stipend will be awarded to IVET students during their fourth year, to assist in paying for expenses associated with their clinical rotations.

Deadline: Applications must be received no later than May 1, 2018.
