#### April Reopening and why I think that's the best timeframe.

Thank you also to everyone who completed the Interest in Enrollment survey. Your input is very important to me as I look to the future of our program. One consistent question was, "Why the school is looking to reopen in April?" There are several reasons, including April is when Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church is planning on reopening the building for their members. (The building is currently closed for all building users and services.) With the warmer spring weather we will be able to hold more of our programming outdoors for the safety and well-being of the children and our staff. In the interim, we will continue to observe other programs which have reopened to update our protocols as necessary to ensure as safe a school setting as possible. Lastly, I remain hopeful better therapeutics, potentially a vaccine for adults, and additional Covid mitigation efforts will be readily available to the community by our planned April reopening timeline.

The recently released article by the <u>American Academy of Pediatrics study on Covid in Child Care Settings</u> discusses how, with proper protocols and low community transmission rates, child care settings have had very low transmission rates between child to child and child to staff. This research reinforces my belief we can have a safe reopening in April.

Enrollment Information and forms will be mailed to all families who registered for the 2020-2021 school year in mid-November. The package will include an Enrollment form for the April 6 - June 16, 2021 program, Camp Registration Information, a Camp Application, and the 2021-2022 School Year Application. These forms and applications will also be available on the school website in mid-November. Full details on these programs were attached as a separate document with this newsletter's distribution.

Security Update: Over the summer BHPCNS applied for a grant from the Maryland Center for School Safety. BHPCNS has been awarded a safety and security grant in the amount of \$45,000. These funds will be used to complete the work started this past spring, using the funds from last year's security grant award, to finalize the mass communication system for all building users, adding additional security cameras, replacing the brown entry doors and the doors leading to the lower level of the building, and improving our door access control systems. The new funds will be used for exterior lighting upgrades, adding loud speakers for communicating outdoors, replacing the

green doors, and more. The BHPCNS Board's Safety and Security Committee will be working on getting estimates, identifying vendors, hiring, and overseeing these improvements.

#### Other fun Thanksgiving ideas include:

- 1. Plan a special Thanksgiving breakfast and have your child help you make it.
- 2. Involve your child with the Thanksgiving menu planning and where possible, have your child help with the cooking.
- 3. Make turkey hats labeled with what you child is thankful for. (See link above in parade description.)
- 4. Make special Thanksgiving placemats, table decorations, door wreaths, etc. with your children.
- 5. Send homemade Thanksgiving cards to those who can't be with you. Have your child tell the recipient why they are special to your child.
- 6. Focus on the positives of Thanksgiving this year, whatever the positives may be for your family. Preschool aged children live in the here and now. They won't remember that last year you traveled away for Thanksgiving, or there were more people over for dinner.
- 7. Organize a neighborhood bike, stroller, pet, marching parade. Wear costumes or not<sup>©</sup> Cone off the street or use driveways to set up tables with hot cider and cookies, Thanksgiving crafts, face painting, etc. to celebrate.
- 8. Google Preschool Thanksgiving Crafts or Ways to Show Gratitude for many, many, more activities to do at home or at a relative's house.
- 9. Over Zoom or FaceTime
  - have a special someone read a Thanksgiving story to your child
  - have your child teach someone a Thanksgiving song or finger play
  - have someone teach/create a holiday craft with your child
  - simultaneously watch sports or a Thanksgiving program, maybe the Macy's Thanksgiving Parade



#### SUPER FRIEND - A SOCIAL STORY FOR BUILDING FRIENDSHIP SKILLS!

Scripted Stories for Social Situations are used at BHPCNS to help children understand social interactions, situations, expectations, social cues, the script of unfamiliar activities, and/or social rules. As the title implies, the stories are brief descriptive stories that provide information regarding a social situation. When children are given information that helps them understand the expectations of a situation, their problem behavior within that situation is reduced or minimized.

How to Be A Super Friend. A Super Friend is a child who learns how to play and interact with his friends and family. At BHPCNS we read social stories and model appropriate behaviors to help children learn the give and take of play in a group setting. Stories also help children identify their feelings and how they can be Super Friends. Ask your child about being a Super Friend. Social stories can be easily customized. If you'd like a copy of the story for home, let me know.

#### PREVIEW OF UPCOMING PROGRAMMING & ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

#### **BHPCNS Programming Information:**

- Preschool programming will be April 6<sup>th</sup> through June 16, 2021
- There will be 2 Summer Camp Sessions
  - o Session 1 June 21 and July 1, 2021
  - o Session 2 July 6 and July 16, 2021
- Registration for the 2021-2022 Preschool programs is now open for new and current students. Applications are available on the school website.

#### Spring Semester, Camp and 2021-2022 Enrollment Paperwork:

A mailing to all 2020-2021 registered families will be sent in mid-November. The mailing will include:

- 1. Acceptance Letter/Enrollment Form for the April 6 June 16 Preschool program
- 2. Summer Camp Registration Form
- 3. Application Form for the 2021-2022 Preschool program

Completed paperwork may be mailed, emailed, or returned in person in the office. Call the office at 301-365-2909 prior to making a hand delivery to confirm someone will be in the building to collect your paperwork. Applications are considered completed when the application and tuition payment 1 is received.

In order to guarantee a child's place we will need your confirmation of enrollment by December 11, 2020. After that date we will open up the program to children on the waiting list.

All programming is subject to change based on the public heath pandemic requirements as set forth by local, state, and federal governments, and Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church. BHPCNS also reserves the right to cancel programming due to low enrollment numbers.
