ORDINANCE NO. 4226

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF A COLLECTION FEE ON ALL DEBTS AND OBLIGATIONS DUE THE CITY OF GARNETT, KANSAS, OTHER THAN THOSE ARISING FROM MUNICIPAL COURT OPERATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GARNETT, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: (A) Any person liable for the payment of any fee, penalty or charge or other debt of any type or description, except such as arise from the operation of the Municipal Court, which is due and owing the City of Garnett, Kansas, together with interest accrued thereon at the legal rate (unless a higher rate is determined to apply thereto), sometimes referred to as the "Debt", and who shall fail or refuse to pay the same after being given due notice thereof, shall be liable to pay in addition to such debt and interest all reasonable costs of collection related thereto.

(B) Costs of collection shall be deemed an administrative fee, in connection with such Debt, made necessary by the defendant's failure to pay the same. Costs of collection shall include, but are not limited to, court costs, surcharges, attorney fees and collection agency fees; provided, however, costs of collection shall not include both attorney fees and collection agency fees.

(C) The city of Garnett is authorized to utilize the collection services of contracting agents pursuant hereto for the purpose of collection all such Debt. Contracts shall provide for the payment of any amounts collected to the City Clerk, after first deducting the collection fee. In accounting for amounts collection, the Clerk shall credit the person's amount owner for the amount of the net proceeds collected. The Clerk shall not reduce the amount owed by any person that portion of any payment which constitutes the cost of collection.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and its publication in an official newspaper of the City of Garnett.

# MINUTES (NOT YET APPROVED) CITY OF GARNETT, KANSAS PLANNING COMMISSION JANUARY 18, 2022

The January 18, 2022, regular meeting of the Garnett Planning Commission was called to order at 1811 by Chair Mersman. Other members present were Vice Chair Peterson, and Commrs. Frye, Norman, Scott, and Thomas. Also present were Zoning Administrator Mills, City Attorney Solander, and Chamber of Commerce Director Hix. Citizens present were Reuben Feuerborn and Nick Durant, both of Williams Monuments.

Chair Mersman asked for comments on the minutes asked for comment on the minutes of the December 21, 2021, regular meeting. There were no comments. Commr. Norman moved, and Vice Chair Peterson seconded, to approve the minutes of the December meeting. The motion carried 5-0. Commr. Scott abstained.

Chair Mersman then asked for Citizens to be heard. Sherri Benjamin, of Community Heart and Soul was on the agenda, but not present during the meeting. Ms. Benjamin conducted her business individually with the persons present before the meeting, and left prior to the meeting being called to order. There were no other citizens to be heard.

Chair Mersman opened the public hearing for the Application for Rezoning submitted by Williams Monuments, through Reuben Feuerborn. Mills explained that the property generally located at 519 E 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue was purchased by Williams Monuments, and demolished the vacant house thereupon, with the intent to construct a storefront on the subject property. The subject property is in an R-3, Flexible Residential Dwelling District, which prohibits commercial establishments. To establish a business on the property, it must be rezoned to B-1, General Business District. Mills briefly explained his findings of fact, and recommended to the Board that the submit their approval to the Governing Body to approve the application for rezoning.

Mills asked Mr. Feuerborn if he had anything to add that he would like the board to consider. He spoke briefly about their intent, and business strategy. The board asked a few questions, and Commr. Norman moved to recommend that the Governing Body approve the request for rezoning. Commr. Scott seconded. Motion carried, 6-0. Chair Mersman closed the public hearing.

Chair Mersman then opened the public hearing as the Board of Zoning Appeals, for the Application for Variance submitted by Mark Powls, 207 E 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The hearing was conducted in absentia. Mills explained that he was contacted in late November by a citizen asking what was being built at the address. At the time, Mills was unaware of any construction taking place at the address, as no permit had been requested. He explained the circumstances of his contact with the owner, Mr. Powls, their interaction, and the necessary steps to finish his construction.

Mills further explained his findings of fact to the board, and recommended denying the Application for Variance, as Mr. Powls's request did not meet all the criteria for variance. The board discussed amongst themselves the precedent set by previous similar applications, and the City's wishes to take a firm stance on setback requirements.

Once the discussion had concluded, Vice Chair Peterson moved, and Commr. Thomas seconded, to deny the Application for Variance submitted by Mark Powls. Motion carried 6-0. Chair Mersman closed the public hearing.

Chair Mersman asked for old business. There was none. She then introduced the new business, election of officers for 2022. Mills explained that the bylaws require the election of officers at the first regular meeting of the year. He further explained that the board could retain their current officers, or replace either or both of them. Commr. Norman moved to retain the current officers for 2022. Commr. Thomas seconded. Motion carried 6-0.

Commr. Norman moved to adjourn. Commr. Thomas seconded. Motion carried 6-0.

There being no other business before this Planning Commission, Chair Mersman adjourned at 1827, the next regular meeting to be February 15, 2022.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 4227

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 15 AND SECTION 17 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF GARNETT, ESTABLISHING NEW PERIODIC CHARGES FOR REFUSE SERVICE; REPEALING EXISTING SECTION 15 AND SECTION 17 OF SAID TITLE AND CHAPTER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF GARNETT, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: Title 7, Chapter 2, Section 15 of the Municipal Code of the City of Garnett is hereby amended to read as follows:

7-2-15: SERVICE FEES: The following fees shall be applicable for all bills for refuse service after March 1, 2022:

(A) Residential Rates:

1. A refuse service charge of \$<u>18.60</u> per calendar month shall be levied against each residential dwelling unit within the corporate limits of the city for the collection and disposition of solid waste, as required by this chapter.

2. A refuse service charge of \$ 24.80 per calendar month shall be levied against any residential dwelling unit outside the corporate limits of the city for the collection and disposition of solid waste generated by such dwelling unit in any area where such collection service shall from time to time be offered. The existence of a rate schedule for service outside the corporate limits shall not be construed as a general offering of solid waste collection to areas outside the corporate limits, nor any guarantee to its continuation in areas where offered.

(B) Commercial and Industrial Rates: A refuse charge of \$<u>18.60</u> per calendar month shall be levied against each commercial and solid waste customer for the collection and distribution of not more than one cubic yard per month of solid waste, as required by this chapter. For each additional cubic yard of solid waste collected and disposed of per month, over and above one cubic yard for each such customer, the customer shall be charged an additional \$ 3.75 per cubic yard.

(C) Additional Pick Ups: Any solid waste customer requiring more than one pick up of solid waste per week shall be charged as follows:

- The first additional pick up per week, an additional \$<u>10.00</u> per month.
- 2. Two additional pick ups per week, an additional \$ 20.00 per month.
- 3. Three additional pick ups per week, an additional \$ 30.00 per month.
- 4. Four additional pick ups per week, an additional \$\_40.00\_\_\_\_ per month.
- (D) Rental Charges: Each commercial or industrial customer requiring a trash bin shall be furnished one by the city, and there shall be added to each such customer's account a monthly rental charge for such bin as follows:
  - 1. For each one cubic yard container, \$ 8.50
  - 2. For each one and one-half cubic yard container, \$<u>9.00</u>.
  - 3. For each two cubic yard container, \$ 10.00
  - For each three cubic yard container, \$<u>16.25</u>.
  - 5. For each four cubic yard container, \$ 18.75
  - 6. For each six cubic yard container, \$ 25.00

SECTION 2: Title 7, Chapter 2, Section 18 of the MunicipalCode of the City of Garnett is hereby amended to read as follows:

7-2-18: PARTIAL SERVICE; EXCEPTIONS: The following fees shall be applicable for all bills for refuse service after March 1, 2022:

- (A) Any person, at the time of beginning or terminating service, who receives service for a period of fewer than 15 consecutive days shall be billed at one-half the rate for such service; for service of 15 or more consecutive days, the charge shall be at the full monthly rate.
- (B) Where collections are to be made to households of a single occupancy, such householder, regardless of age, shall be entitled to a special rate of \$<u>16.74</u> per month, which shall entitle said household to regular residential refuse collection

and disposal services. It shall be the duty of any householder making application for exception under this subsection to furnish the city with sufficient proof, either by affidavit or otherwise, that he or she is entitled to such exception.

SECTION 3: Title 7, Chapter 2, Section 15 and Section 17 of the Municipal Code of the City of Garnett, as the same presently exist, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and its publication in an official City newspaper.

- 1. That the Sponsor shall assume all liability in connection with said Home and Garden Expo and will indemnify the City in all particulars against any liability, both as to injury or property damage; and
- 2. The Sponsor agrees to assume any and all responsibility of policing the grounds, including the parking of motor cars and to generally clean up the litter that may accumulate on the grounds; and
- 3. The Sponsor further agrees to restore the area to its original condition following said event; and
- 4. The Sponsor further agrees to have active liability insurance coverage in the amount of at least \$500,000/\$1,000,000 naming the City as additional insured; and
- 5. The City agrees to provide electric and refuse services for said event.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall extend to the successors and assigns of the parties.

THIS AGREEMENT, Made and entered into by and between the CITY OF GARNETT, KANSAS, a Municipal Corporation, by the Mayor, and attested by the City Clerk, hereinafter City, and Hope Anthem Church, hereinafter referred to as Sponsor.

A copy of such liability insurance policy or policies shall be furnished to City not less than thirty (30) days prior to the first date of the race scheduled and conducted under this Agreement.

Sponsor shall clean up all litter and refuse that may accumulate on the grounds during any such use and to dispose of the same in accordance with the directions of the City. In the event that the area is wet or muddy, all motor homes and trailers will be parked only on graveled or other hard surface parking areas.

Sponsor shall be responsible for all such repairs as may be necessary to restore the North City Park to a condition the same as it was prior to any use under the terms of this agreement. During the periods of general usage, Sponsor shall be granted the right to have exclusive possession of all of the park premises, except the area as lies south of the hairpin curve commonly known as "Flatiron Corner" (where North Lake Road divides leading either to the east or to the west side of Lake Garnett). This excludes the swimming pool, tennis courts, ball fields, stadium, and Community Building and Fair Barns. The rights granted during general usage shall include the sole right to conduct and control concessions upon the grounds and to charge admission to spectators of the go-kart racing.

Sponsor may allow race participants and race officials to park a recreational vehicle or pitch a tent in the pit or paddock areas without Sponsor or such participant or official Agreement Page Two

being liable to pay any camping fee to the City. However, nothing in this agreement shall be construed to waive any camping fee for any other camping in the park, or any other applicable park user fee.

During the periods denominated "Gate Guard Only", Sponsor shall have the right to maintain a guard at the front gate, so as to protect the area from unauthorized use. However, this is not intended to permit Sponsor unnecessarily to restrict or limit access to the Park facilities during these limited hours. And while Sponsor shall have discretion with respect to admitting or not admitting people during this period, Sponsor agrees to exercise such discretion in a responsible manner so as to permit reputable, law-abiding citizens to a full use of the Park facilities during such period as is possible. - (b) Any and all responsibility of policing the grounds; of directing traffic, including the parking of motor vehicles; and of cleaning up all litter and refuse that may accumulate on the grounds during any such use and to dispose of the same in accordance with the directions of the City. With respect to:
  - Motor Vehicles, no cars shall be parked or driven upon the golf course, fairways, or greens. In the event that the area is wet or muddy, all motor vehicles will be parked only on graveled or other hard surface parking areas; and
