**500 Generations**

This photo: Many millennia of doing all the hard work of keeping and moving camp made Blackfeet women the strongest, toughest anywhere. The Blackfeet: We are the Anisikapi Pikani (translated Southern Piegan, but you can just call us Blackfeet). Our reservation is in Montana and we, along with our three Canadian tribes (Northern Piegan, Siksika, and Kainai) comprise the Blackfoot Confederacy, 37,300 Tribal members, about half live on our 1.5 million acre reservation, fortunate to still live on our ancestral lands (most tribes were forced off their homelands in the 1800s), recent archeology and DNA puts us here 13,500 years ago. American Indians: We are nearly invisible, often misunderstood, a mystery to many because less than 1% of Americans are enrolled members of tribes (and less than half of us live on reservations). 573 tribes, 335 reservations, 3% of lands within the U.S. Tribes are sovereign nations, meaning self-governing, self-determining. Each tribe has its own laws and constitution, aren't subject to state jurisdiction, and are largely free from federal interference or governance. Most tribes have their own police, courts, government, social services, schools, regulatory agencies.
