Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Feast of Sts Peter & Paul

Year C

Matthew 16:13-19

Our Holy Day Feast of Sts Peter and Paul today, marks two foundational leaders of our faith in Jesus. They both have blessedly unique and differing styles of ministry. St Peter as our first chief shepherd, or Pope, (Matt 16:18) and St Paul as our first chief missionary (Acts 9:15 & 22:21). Their differing roles in ministry wonderfully complement one another. I heard someone describe it once as, "Peter covering the base and keeping the home fires lit in Rome, while Paul carried the torch outward in missionary work to all the world." Of course, both Peter and Paul engaged in *any* ministry (home or away) that they could, to serve Christ and His Church. So, we really can't claim that Peter never engaged in missionary work, nor that Paul didn't do his share of home-church maintenance. We have in the New Testament Literature, copies of both of their pastoral letters sent to communities expressing their leadership concerns for growing faith among the church (in addition to the Acts of the Apostles account of the early church history). But Peter as first Pope, does seem preoccupied with the unity and centralization of the Christian faith and practice, while Paul is eager to draw in more and more believers by his missionary zeal founding new communities for the Church anywhere. Of course, the other eleven apostles had their own leadership and missionary roles too. Yet, Peter and Paul are the most prominent, and likely because they also share the same martyrdom year-date and location, in Rome, 64 A.D. under the persecution of Emperor Nero. Peter and Paul both have a Roman Basilica Church place marking their location of execution and burial. Of the four major Basilicas in Rome, one is **St Peter's Basilica** in the Vatican and another is **Basilica of St Paul Outside the Walls** just outside the Vatican. Both are built over the burial sites of Peter and Paul respectively (the other two major basilicas are **St John Lateran Basilica** and **St Mary Major Basilica**). But even in their burial sites we can get the impression of St Peter administratively based in Rome, and St Paul on the road leading out of Vatican City, carrying the message outward in mission. Certainly though, both saints sacrificed their lives in service to the gospel of Jesus Christ. They followed His command that "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Matt 16:24). Even unto death, which they both did, 'loving Christ's own to the end' (John 13:1-2). So, we honor them today and thank God for the witness of faithful disciples!

A great spiritual exercise to undertake on this feast would be to read one each of the NT letters of Peter and Paul. While Peter only has two letters, Paul has thirteen (*Of course, there is dispute among scholars about whether Paul wrote every one of the thirteen or only seven of them with secretaries finishing the others*). There are 27 books in the New Testament. As an encouragement for people to read the actual texts, I like to emphasize that some of the books are quite short (*so you can spend as little as 30 minutes and be able to say afterward, that you read four books of the NT today!*) Paul's shortest letter is his Letter to Philemon and Peter's shortest is 2 Peter. I encourage you to read them for yourself. They give a window into the heart and personality of each saint. We can sense what concerns them, through the emotion and message they are communicating to the congregation or person they are writing to. Among my list of favorite NT letters is this Letter to Philemon, where I find Paul being his most rhetorically persuasive in a diplomatic way (*he is often not 'diplomatic'*) to encourage Philemon to 'do the right thing' about slavery. A favorite letter of mine from Peter is his first one, where he quotes Psalm 90:4 and reminds us to be patient, since 'a thousand days are as one day to God' (2 Peter 3:8). Peter is saying, that our impatience is not about God being slow to answer us, but it is more about our being slow to understand His Ways (in the end we are going to wish for that 'more or long time' we first complained about!) Also, if we are ever slow to understand something, we are not alone, because in this same letter Peter humbly admits that some of Paul's lengthy letters are 'difficult to understand' (2 Peter 3:16). But thanks be to God we have such a diverse witness to sanctity in the many lives (of which Peter and Paul are only two!) within the Communion of Saints that we look up to, to guide our following of Jesus!
