

ATVs



Steve Levian won overall. He must have been on fire. He was slow getting off the line, but by the end of the first lap, he had a substantial lead and never let go.

Randall Mathis won the over 40 class (*the same class I ride*). He also won the over 40 class in the series with two first place finishes and one third. Randall, were you in Bolivar early Sunday morning with a pipe wrench?


