

# Getaway to Boothbay Harbor, Maine

July 11 - 14, 2021

## Sunday ♦ Travel Day

Early morning departure for Boothbay Harbor, Maine. We will check into the Boothbay Harbor Inn, located directly on the waterfront with picturesque views and just across a footbridge from the bustling downtown area. The Inn features 60 spacious and modern rooms, most have views of the harbor. Enjoy an arrival welcome reception followed by delicious dinner at the Inn. (D)

## Monday ♦ Boothbay Harbor

After our buffet breakfast at the Inn, we'll meet our local guide for a 2-hour tour of Boothbay Harbor highlights including a unique church built by boat builders, the haunted opera house, the inner harbor area and Ocean Point.

Our tour ends at the waterfront where we have time to have lunch on our own and explore the local shops and galleries.

This afternoon, we take a guided tour of the nearby Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens. See the beautiful coastline along woodland paths and along the river bank. Here the majestic Maine woods meet the rocky shore. The wetlands shore and the fern glens meet the moss and lichen covered ledges in a variety of special theme gardens such as the wildflower garden and children's garden.

Next, we will visit the Boothbay Railway Village which represents a turn-of-the-20th-century Maine village containing railroad memorabilia, antique cars and trucks and such restored buildings as a blacksmith shop, red schoolhouse and general store as well as the 1847 Boothbay town hall, Freeport railway

station and the charming Spruce Point chapel. A ride on a narrow-gauge, coal-fired steam engine is included.

Don your souvenir Maine Lobster Hat for a traditional lobsterbake dinner at the Boothbay Railway Village's 1847 Boothbay Town Hall: This is Boothbay's historic Town Hall moved to the museum location but the town's annual meeting still takes place here each May. Your meal includes fish chowder, chips, corn on the cob, rolls, lemonade and Maine blueberry cake for dessert. BBQ chicken and a vegetarian entree' will be offered. Return to the hotel in time to watch the sun set as this side of the harbor offers the best sunset views! (B, D)

## Tuesday ♦ Local touring

After breakfast we visit the Pemaquid Lighthouse, one of Maine's most scenic beacons and the light featured on the Maine state quarter. We will stop for a photo here, climb to the top of the lighthouse if you'd like and visit the Pemaquid Fisherman's Museum. The museum features artifacts from the fishing and lobstering industries and lighthouse service.

We will enjoy a plated lunch included at a wharf-side restaurant overlooking the harbor in Round Pond.

This afternoon, we take a special aquaculture outing on a nearby oyster farm cruise. Learn how oyster farmers prepare the farm equipment and sow the world-famous Damariscotta River oysters while bald eagles, ospreys and migratory birds hover around.

Return to the hotel to relax and freshen up before an included dinner in the hotel dining room this evening, followed by local sing-a-long entertainment (8-10pm). (B, L)

After we enjoy a full breakfast at the Inn this morning, we'll depart for home. (B)
