2018 Spring Quarterly Newsletter: Prevention Tip: Boundaries

While no man, woman, or child deserves or is at fault for being a victim of abuse, a powerful tool in preventing sexual assault, dating violence, and/or child abuse is boundaries.

- 1. <u>**Teaching Boundaries:**</u> Children who are allowed to set respectful boundaries with whom, how, and when they want to give physical affection are taught that their bodies are their own.
- 2. <u>Establish Boundaries:</u> Young adults who date can avoid being isolated by dating violence if they keep at least some part of their lives– interests, friends, time, goals– independent from their dating partners.
- 3. <u>Maintain Boundaries:</u> When necessary, being forceful, clear, and firm through words and body language about a personal boundary can help deter a potential sexual assault.
- 4. **<u>Respect Boundaries:</u>** Teaching children and young adults to ask and consider the boundaries of others reduces the likelihood of future sexual and dating violence.
