

Last Rites Held For Elkton Lady, 73

April 11, 1948

Funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon for Mrs. William Harvey, 73, who passed away unexpectedly early Sunday evening in her Elkton home. Death was attributed to a heart attack.

The Rev. L. E. Burgess officiated at the services in Methodist church. Burial was in Colfax Cemetery, Bad Axe.

Born Jessie Portis Alexander on April 11, 1875, in Chandler township, she was the daughter of
