COMMITTEE WORK:

MCPS Budget Advisory Committee

There are, of course, still many moving parts to formulating the budget and there is greater uncertainty this year than in any other since the Great Recession in 2008-09, but there are positive signs that we will get more funding from the state and federal government than the conservative estimates that were used to compile the current proposed budget.

- Enrollment is down roughly 5,000 students which, at ~\$15,000 per student implies a \$75 million impact
 - **Update**: The State will fund schools based on prior year enrollment, alleviating the potential loss of revenue to MCPS
- Additional funding shortfalls from county, state and federal sources are probable due to the impact of revenue shortfalls and increased costs because of the Covid-19 pandemic. There is hope that the

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Governor's veto of Kirwan will be overridden but there are still safeguards in the bill that could mean that the funding streams would still be stymied.

- **Update**: The MD House has voted to override the veto of Kirwan and at least one of the primary finding sources. MD The Senate is expected to do the same on Thursday, February 11, 2021.
- There is funding for state and local governments as well as schools in President Biden's RELIEF Act and there appears to be a willingness/ability to pass the bill with those funds included. That alleviates some of the financial pressures on the state and county budgets.
- MCPS has convened another meeting of the Budget Advisory Committee on Tuesday, February 16th to discuss the new revenue forecasts and what, if any, modifications they will recommend to the Board of Education prior to submitting the FY22 Operating Budget to the County Executive and Council.

FY22 Budget & Operating Budget Testimony Workshop

- There are no firm dates for MCCPTA testimony to the County Council as yet. It is possible that we will be limited to submitting testimony from AVPs, rather than CCs, this year. That is what the County Council did with the CIP testimony, however, I will advocate for each CC to have the normal amount of time allotted. There are many issues and two minutes is insufficient to cover the needs of five (5) clusters.
