### From the Administrative Assistant's Desk

Dear Friends,

The pandemic, with its subsequent lockdowns and restrictions, has posed unique challenges for churches and their congregations. Last year, in fact, in most cases services for Holy Week and Easter were not just limited; they were cancelled entirely. Given that Holy Week and Easter are the most important events in the Christian Church year, it was devastating for many believers not to be able to participate in a Worship setting for those observances. While they certainly could (and did) note the important dates in their homes and personal lives, it was not the same as joining fellow disciples to be led in prayer by a pastor. No palms waving as they heard the familiar Bible readings about Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. No somber remembrance of Christ's sacrifice, crucifixion, and death. No celebration of His triumphant Resurrection, and the subsequent salvation for His followers. There were no Easter egg hunts, fellowship events, or breakfast potlucks as there had been every year for decades. Few area churches had the technology to share their services via the Internet, and they would spend months finding new ways to reach the people who used to weekly populate the pews.

Here in Beloit, the LCMS churches have routinely partnered for many events, and 2020 was no exception. St. John's initially offered a combined broadcast of Sunday services with Messiah Lutheran until the latter was able to install the technology in their own sanctuary. They also continued to teach their confirmands together, via Zoom classes.

Which brings us to 2021. The prior twelve months have wrought substantial changes in the way the church community has offered Worship services. Pastors and church councils have had to often reevaluate their approaches based on the frequent adjustments to CDC recommendations, as well as state and local health protocols. With care, concern, and significant protections in place, the churches have reopened. For many, Sunday School, Bible study, and confirmation classes have resumed, and now the people have their eyes eagerly fixed on the fast-approaching Holy Week, with innovative ideas for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Morning services.

During previous Good Friday services, local LCMS pastors have worked together to present the special Tre Ore Service. The three-hour offering, originally introduced in the seventeenth century, commemorates Christ's time on the cross. This year, four area LCMS pastors will still be teaming up, but from their own churches. Each hour of the unique service will take place at a different church, and people are invited to those churches for in-person Worship during the noted times, or they can choose to view part or all of the services on-line.

Reverend Dennis Roser of St. John's Lutheran Church, Reverend Dan Eddy of Messiah Lutheran Church, and Reverend Randall Senn of Trinity Lutheran Church, all of Beloit, and Reverend Gene Dassow of Christ Our Savior, Roscoe, have been planning this presentation for months.

"It's taken a great deal of preparation to coordinate three consecutive live broadcasts from three separate locations," stated Reverend Eddy of Messiah Lutheran. "We want the transitions to be smooth, the quality to be consistent, and still maintain the proper level of somber respect for the occasion. We also needed to make sure we weren't duplicating any readings or hymns in our respective plans."

Reverend Roser explained the idea behind the multiple location service, "In this way, we can livestream the Tre Ore while also offering in-person worship on Good Friday that is socially distanced, and will not keep people together in one space for such a long duration."

The service schedule is as follows:

<u>Friday, April 2</u> - The Good Friday Tre Ore Service is being offered in its entirety online. Each hour will take place at a different church, and people are invited to those churches for in-person Worship during the noted times.

**12:00 to 12:55 pm** – This first hour is being hosted by Christ Our Savior in Roscoe with Reverend Gene Dassow. This hour can be viewed on their Facebook page.

**1:00 to 1:55 pm** – The second hour is at St. John's Church in Beloit with both Reverend Dennis Roser and Reverend Randall Senn, of Trinity Lutheran Church leading the service. Members of both congregations are invited to attend at St. John's, and this hour will be streamed on the St. John's Facebook page.

**2:00 - 3:00 pm -** The final hour will be at Messiah Lutheran Church with Reverend Dan Eddy closing the service recounting Christ's Agony. This hour can be found on Messiah's Facebook page.

The public is invited to attend the services in-person. Masks are necessary for attendance,

and local requirements for health and safety will be followed. Those wishing to view the services on-line can find the links of the church Facebook pages. You do not need to be a member of Facebook to access the broadcasts.


and shared on Facebook each week.

In the Word

"My command is this: Love each other as I have I have loved you." John 15:12

### Of the Word

Jesus did not suggest we love each other - He commands we do it. 
