I love it when the reel screams

The last time we fished Castic we wore that stripe home. This is a new year, so it was back to seek our revenge! The plan was to troll for Mr Stripie. I had all of the usual tools. U-rigs, LC some top water toys that we are not likely to need bait and wait, vintage deans. I left the swim bait stuff because you can't bring it all!

Joe met me at 5:45. we loaded up headed out. Around Magic mountain things went sideways as in slow motion. It was stop and crawl for a go 30 min. I head from Ron, was at the lake. We stopped at the usual spot and they had all of the exotic bait. Joe invested in some lug worms. We stopped on the hill at the lake to check for water after that it on to the hunt. We launched the boat and hung that first right. Next problem, there is no map on the FF. It's kind of hard to do the urig thing W/O a contour map. We managed to only hang it up on the bottom once and got it all back. The problem was we were not getting bit. There were some catch able marks but no love. Joe was dragging two lines for nadda. We headed to the ski arm trying to hit all the humps. Finally, bingo I draw first blood. A smallie. I had not caught any in years. The skunk smell is off the boat. There were about half a dozen boat anchored in the mouth of the dam area. One boat was hanging some fish so we anchored for the bait and wait. After about 20 min we moved the boat, after another 15 or so we left. We can catch fish on the troll in a few areas near the dam, so we hit them. Then it happened Joe hooked up, he was fishing the way back.

Miss Pinkies brother did the trick. It was a decent striper over 2lbs. I told him if he did that again, we were going to have to change up everything. Yep, next he landed a smallie and it was bigger than mine!

I pulled the u-rig and put out Mis pinky. Joe caught another striper! This one was closer to the boat. Now he offered me any lure in his box. I went for the purple. I ran it on the short line. We did another lap and Joe caught another striper. Now he had stopped the last four fish! That's it, I told Joe that we were going the wrong way and we had to turn the boat around. He was on the inside and was getting all the hits. He said you can move one of you rods to his side of the boat. No, we started trolling clockwise. We made it thru one loop and then there was the scream! Finally, I get my first striper she went 3lbs 7oz and she was the biggest one on the boat. We make another loop and then a quick bat turn and more screaming. A little bigger fish for me 3lbs 8 oz. W fished a little more but the clock was running down so we took some for the thurny. That is when I noticed that the phone had not sent the first pic. We made the run back to the launch to check if anyone was there for weigh in and get some more bars on the phone. We just packed it in and went home. It was cold and dark all day. That might be why the u-rig did not produce. I was running light baits on it. All the stripers were caught on the purple baits. Mis Pinky was shut out! We also got caught in a bunch of stop and crawl on the way home as well but no stripe for us today!
