#### **Military mail to Iraq**

Packages and letters for troops deployed to Iraq had to be in the mail by yesterday, November 17. In anticipation of the military's withdrawal from Iraq, the US Postal Service has stopped accepting mail addressed to

military post offices in Iraq. However, mail already in the postal system through November 17 will be processed and delivered to troops in Iraq.

APO mail that arrives in Iraq after a service member has redeployed will be redirected to the new mailing address provided by that individual. If no mailing address was provided, the mail will be returned to sender.

<u>PLEASE BE ADVISED, HOWEVER</u>, that there are many, many other Soldiers in other areas who need our Care Packages and we will continue to serve them with the continued enthusiasm that we have always had.

A PROCLAMATION BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

With every step we take on American soil, we tread on ground made safer for us through the invaluable sacrifices of our service members and their families.
