

Sigel Township Youth Drowns At Port Austin

Gary Charles Gorney, 13, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry J. Gorney, Sigel Township, drowned Monday afternoon while swimming east of the small craft harbor at Port Austin. The incident oc-

curred while the youth was taking part in a family outing with his older brothers and their wives. Officers theorized that Gorney stepped into a hole and went over his head. His body was recovered.

Huron County Sheriff Merritt R. McBride and Marine Deputy Wilford Hyzer. Gorney was the fourth drowning victim in Huron County this year. His father is supervisor of Sigel Township.

Gary Charles Gorney was born January 18, 1956 at Bad Axe and was an eighth grade student at Rapson rural school.

Surviving are his parents; three brothers, Daniel Gorney, Bad Axe, Arnold Gorney, Sterling Heights, and Kenneth Gorney, Marlette; two sisters, Misses Janet and Carol Gorney, both living at home, and his grandparents, Mrs. Mary Gorney, Kinde, and Alex Talaski, Bad Axe.

Remains are at the MacAlpine Funeral Home, Bad Axe, where Rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Tuesday.

Funeral services will be 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Joseph Catholic Church, Rapson. The Very Reverend Joseph C. Karaba, OSB, will officiate with burial in the church cemetery.
