He was a member of the Scenic Golf & Country Club, Pigeon, and served on the Village of Pigeon Council for many years. He was also a member of the Thumb National Bank & Trust Company Board of Directors from 1972-1997. He was also formerly involved with fundraising for Scheurer Hospital in Pigeon.

Mr. Webber was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church, Berne.
