American Eagle Day June 20, 2025

Celebrated annually on June 20, the observance commemorates the day in 1782, when the bird was added to the official Seal of the United States.

An American Symbol

On the front side of the Great Seal of the United States, a bald

eagle is depicted holding an olive branch in its right talon and 13 arrows in its left. The olive branch and arrows symbolize the United States' commitment to peace and its readiness for war, while the number of arrows – 13 – refers to the original 13 states.

This side of the seal is considered the coat of arms of the US and is used on most official US government documents.

In addition to being an important American national symbol, bald eagles hold significant value in many Native American cultures and religions, where the birds signify freedom, strength, honesty, wisdom, and power.

Both the national bird and animal of the United States, bald eagles were brought back

from the brink of extinction in the mid-1990s after a nationwide conservation and protection effort. Due to the widespread use of pesticides such as DDT, illegal hunting practices and the destruction of their natural habitats by human activity, the numbers of these majestic birds of prey fell down to a mere 400 in the 1960s.

After DDT was banned in the US and Canada, the numbers of the birds started to grow. By 1995, the birds were removed from the endangered species list. It is hard to accurately count the number of bald eagles, but scientists currently estimate that in the late 2000s, there were about 10,000 nesting pairs of birds in the contiguous United States.

Addressing Hazards in the Roadway

There are many different types of hazards you will encounter in the roadway while riding your motorcycle. Striking objects with your motorcycle is much more dangerous and has much greater consequences than if you had struck the same object with a car, SUV or pick-up truck. If you strike a pot hole, piece of truck tire, or any other substantial piece of debris with a 4-wheel vehicle the results might be a flat tire or some minor cosmetic damage. If you struck the same object with a motorcycle the result could be a crash.

Some types of hazards you might encounter in the roadway are as follows:

- Wet or dry grass clippings being blown into the road during mowing.
- Gravel kicked into the road by cars and trucks.

- 3. Tree branches falling from trees above the road.
- 4. Wet or dry leaves.
- 5. Dirt washed onto the road during a rain storm.
- Deep puddles during or after a rain storm.
- Motorcycles or other vehicles approaching from the opposite direction intruding onto your side of the road going around a curve.
- 8. Pieces of truck tire. (Florida Gator)
- 9. Snow or ice
- 10. And many more.

Make sure if you have to surmount any of the potential slippery examples I have listed, you take as much lean angle as possible out of your bike before you make contact to reduce the chance of sliding out and losing control. No braking, down shifting or abrupt throttle deceleration while crossing over these areas. Just pull in the clutch and coast over the slippery surface. If you have to surmount a large object such as a two by four, or a piece of truck tire, you must momentarily become a dirt bike rider. Hold on to the hand grips, stand up enough to use your knees as shock absorbers, give the throttle a blip-on just before the front tire contacts the object and then immediately roll-off of the throttle so the rear tire can

easily go over the object. This method also works in reducing the shock when going over a hole in road or speed humps.

The best way to avoid any hazard is not to encounter it in the first place. To be able to avoid a hazard you must see it soon enough and far enough away so you have enough time and space to avoid it. Braking or swerving only works if you have enough time and distance to execute these maneuvers. A person needs at least two seconds to react. It takes about one second for your eyes to tell your brain something needs to be done. It takes about another second for your hands and feet to begin to move to accomplish whatever action is required. Much literature has now been changed to three seconds being the minimum amount of reaction time required. More is better. The proper reaction time distance directly related to the proper following distance. If you are closer than 2-3 seconds behind the vehicle in front of you, you will not have enough time and distance to react should some hazard appear.

Riding at night reduces your reaction time even if there is not a vehicle in front of you. There is a line between where your headlight is lighting the road and the darkness just beyond your headlight beam. The distance of this line depends on your

speed and headlight adjustment. This line should also always be 2-3 seconds ahead of you. If that distance is shorter than 2-3 seconds slow down accordingly.

A legally, properly adjusted headlight is supposed to illuminate 150 ft. ahead on low beam and 450 ft. ahead on high beam. At 50 mph the distance of two second ahead of you is already 150 ft. If you are going faster, such as 70 mph on the interstate, you are already over riding your low beam head light's illumination distance. You can switch to high beam for additional distance. But, remember if you are running with your high beam on and

another vehicle is approaching you from the opposite direction, legally you must switch back to low beam at 500 ft. from it. If you switch to low beam until the other vehicle passes you are now drastically over riding your low beam headlight distance.
