

Declaration of Jeffrey C. Jamison


On May 31, 2016, I was in my living area cubicle # 19 in building unit 4B at FDC Beaumont Low in Beaumont Texas. At approximately 4:00 PM my cell-mate Gary L. McDuff walked into the cubicle. Behind him was U.B. Counselor J. Landry, prison complex Attorney Tina Hauck and DOE Attorney Janie Frank. Mr. Gary McDuff introduced me to Miss. Frank and told me she was here to see the area our Unit Manager Mr. D. Sorrels allowed Gary McDuff to work in on his upcoming hearing. Also where the guard had destroyed his legal documents by pouring water all over them on May 24, 2016. I watched the guard perform this no good deed personally with disbelief. In fact there were more than a dozen witnesses who saw this happen. Several others and myself tried to convince the guard that he was wrong and disrespected the Unit Managers & refer, C.O. M. Michael refused to stop until he had destroyed all the papers and threw stuff them into a large garbage bag. There were A great left floating on the floor. One inmate left the unit and went to the law library to alert Gary McDuff to what was going on in the unit UB to his legal paperwork. None of the inmate could understand why would C.O. Michael do such a dumb thing when he knew how important his hearing was to Gary McDuff life. He had seen Gary working in that space for weeks. Matter of fact everyone in the unit knew that Gary McDuff used that area to work in for at least a month. When Gary McDuff introduced me to Miss. Frank and told me why she was here, He asked me to tell her what I had seen happen to his legal paperwork

on the evening of May 24, 2016. As I began to tell her prison Attorney Tina Hauck and Counselor Landry both stopped Go forward and prevented me from speaking to her, so I could tell her what
