A Note from Pastor Toni

Happy New Year to my YUMC family! 2020 is upon us! It's a new decade, a clean slate, an empty chapter waiting for us to write! God already knows the direction He has for us in 2020. He loves us and has called us to His purpose for His good pleasure!

As I was reading the Bible this morning I was reminded of Paul prayer In Ephesians. He is grateful for their faith and love and for the evidence of that faith and love in the way they live as followers of Jesus. Here is the amazing, heartfelt prayer written by Paul to the people he loved. It echo's my feelings for this church family as well as my prayer for each one of you in this New Year.

"I have not stopped thanking God for you. I pray for you constantly, asking God, the glorious Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, to give you spiritual wisdom and insight so that you might grow in your knowledge of God. I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope He has given to those He called—His holy people who are His rich and glorious inheritance! I also pray that you will understand the incredible greatness of God's power for us who believe in Him..."

It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. How much time are you devoting to your personal spiritual development? Not one of us ought to stop growing, stop seeking, stop learning, stop discovering how to become more Christ-like, and where we fit, in God's amazing story of grace! There is not one of us who would not benefit from immersing ourselves in new opportunities to learn, grow and discover.

That is why I am making my appeal to you, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ, to challenge you in this New Year to get involved in something new that will stimulate your heart, mind and spirit! Challenge yourself by participating in one of our *EQUIP U* discipleship classes offered; to provide ways for all of us to grow as disciples, and to move toward becoming spiritually mature followers. Make a choice that will take you deeper into your relationship with God and the church community. Relationship doesn't happen on Sundays during worship. Relationship happens when we connect in deliberate ways with people, not necessarily like-minded but rather of the same mind. Paul tells us in Philippians 2:2,

"Therefore, if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort for His love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion then make my joy complete by being of the same mind, having the same love toward one another, knit together in spirit, intent on one purpose and living a life that reflects your faith and spreads the gospel—the good news regarding salvation through faith in Christ."

Church, how you think—how you frame your attitude—is crucial to living more like Jesus. In other words, our attitudes and how we think affect the way we live out our faith. Being of the 'same mind' means that we are united in our purpose and motivations not that we always agree.

There is a lack of spiritual maturity in many Christians. They have settled for 'good enough' rather than God's best. Paul says in Eph. 4:14 that as we learn, discover and grow in our understanding of who Christ is and how we are called to be like Him, we will "no longer be immature like"

children. We won't be tossed and blown about by every wind of new teaching. We will not be influenced when people try to trick us with lies so clever they sound like the truth."

In the world we live, without being grounded in God's word and committed in my relationship with Jesus and the community of faith, I am easily swayed by the ways of our culture and our world.

EQUIP U is the result of many months of prayer and preparation intended to provide opportunities for all of us to become more spiritually mature. Not one of us has arrived! We all need to grow and continue to grow. **PLEASE** choose to submit yourselves to whatever God is doing in 2020. PLEASE decide to join in a class that will encourage you to grow, to heal, to discover, to seek.

May you have, with anticipation and courage, a new vision for who you are as a follower of Christ. May we, as the people of YUMC move into this New Year committed to following the Holy Spirit wherever He leads us.



One reader's analysis:

This is a "must read" novel for anyone interested in the 1850's westward journey to reach California and Oregon over the historical Oregon Trail. The pioneers risked everything to make it there and the courage, strength and determination they had to have is an astonishing accomplishment.

Jane Kirkpatrick weaves a grand story based on a true accounting by Ezra Meeker in his 1852 journal. It notes his profound impression of a small group of covered wagons reaching their destination along the Trail. In disbelief, he observes that there were no men in this group of 11 women and children. All the men had died along the way, leaving the women to fend for themselves. Based on this recollection, Ms. Kirkpatrick reveals obvious historical research to enhance the story line and satisfy those historically hungry readers with accurate representations of life along the trail.



hosted by Molly Aumack at Esperanza's Mexican Restaurant (219 W. Miner Yreka, CA) With the new year come ideas about fresh starts for many things, but if you are on the church finance committee, thoughts about the new annual budget is high on your list!

Actually, we think about the budget all year long, adjusting it monthly based on our income and expenditures, evaluating whether or not our money is being well spent. (This is typical for everyone who must balance income and expense.) But as those of us on the YUMC's finance committee begin planning for the new year, we note that church budgeting is a little different from our own personal, at-home budgets. First, at church we do not have a guaranteed or predictable income. Our income expectations are based primarily on past experience--and every financial advisor will warn you not to judge future performance on past performance. Yet the job of the church budget committee is to determine, as best we can, what God's plan is for the church and how to create a budget that will meet it. How do we do that? Not by previous experience or accounting acumen, but solely by PRAYER AND FAITH.

The church budget is based on faith--faith that God has called us to be His people and has given us tasks to accomplish in 2020. But, in modern society we have a lot of routine stuff we need to pay for so we can do His work. Below is where the money goes:

For every dollar donated

11 cents is sent to the Cal-Nev Annual Conference to support their efforts on our behalf

35 cents is used to support the pastor

5 cents is for insurance

10 cents go for utilities

10 cents go to maintain and repair the church building

29 cents go for church programs; youth, worship, education, ministry.

As you can see 71% of the budget is consumed by expenditures we have little control over, although we do work to keep or operational costs as low as possible, so 29% of our budget goes directly to the work of the church in our community and world. We would love to spend all of the church income on ministry, worship, education and youth programs but first we must cover the costs of having a church.

Thank you for your support of our church and God's programs.

The youth were hard at work for "Christmas on the Streets" on December 22nd. They served hot chocolate, cookies and a lot of love!


