EUMA Rainbow Connection Needs

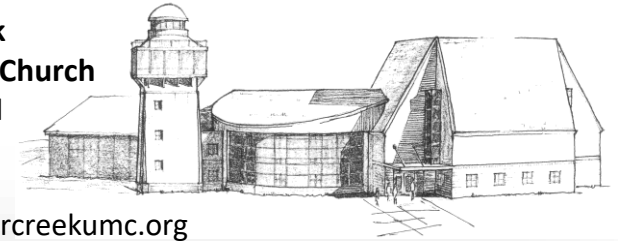
EUMA's Rainbow Connection is in need of multiple household items. If you'd like to donate, please consider the following items:

LEAD persons to commit their lives to God through baptism by water and the spirit and profession of faith in Jesus Christ;

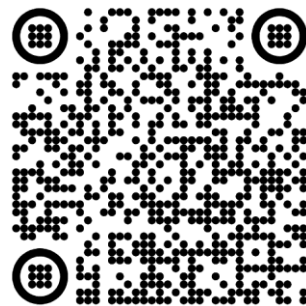
NURTURE persons in Christian living through worship, and the sacraments, spiritual disciplines;
