

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

27th Sunday Ordinary Time

Luke 17:5-10

"Be careful what you ask for?" What the apostles ask Jesus for in today's gospel, sounds innocent enough, "Increase our faith" (Lk 17:5). But listening to Jesus' full response, He implies that their request is presumptuous and grandiose. I hear Jesus addressing the apostles' dramatic desire for attention, and that they are exhibiting a 'grandstanding' or 'showboating' posture.

So how does He respond? With a common enough answer, by saying, "Faith even the size of a mustard seed can remove and transplant a tree into the sea" (Lk 17:6) Jeus shas them focus on the small and seemingly insignificant, a tiny mustard seed. Yet, given time and patience (faith itself), what can that seed accomplish? About Jesus' pronouncement, any one of His resulting claims would be remarkable: That by a word (say to the 'tree'-Lk 17:6), this could happen: 1)the removal of a tree 2) its transplantation in the sea & 3) its presumed survival and growth in the sea? How could any such thing happen? BY SIMPLE FAITH. Jesus is not talking about spectacular magic. He is talking about the unassuming and persistent expression of will and work toward a specific end. A definition of faith, could be, "trusting persistence". Such perseverance continues to act even in the face of seeming defeat or against the longest of odds. Who could think up, some of the great accomplishments of faith? Jesus to rise from the dead? Jesus converting an enemy's heart? Jesus teaching a miser to be generous? What all can Gd do? Hebrews 11:1 says of faith, that it is 'evidence of things unseen'. St Paul says in 2 Corinthians 5:7, that "We walk by faith not by sight" So, Faith sees what is not yet visible. Faith continues working at something even when there is no sign of its success yet. That is a focused persistence!

How might this faith the size of a mustard seed do its work - uprooting a mulberry tree into the sea? Well, it grows and grows and grows, but without any grandstanding attention or any dramatic display. It simply plugs away moment by moment, and inch by inch. Imagine a mulberry tree growing along a wall cliff at the edge of the ocean (or how we see a lot, trees growing atop hill-cliff edges along our parkways and interstates). The mustard seed is deposited into the ground right beside an existing mulberry tree(there are many ways to plant a seed: by wind, by hand, by animal, by rain's movement, etc). Then the mustard seed takes root in the broken soil or crack of a rock beside the mulberry tree. The little mustard tree sapling begins its slow and arduous work of rooting deeper and deeper below, and putting out leaf branches above, while its trunk thickens. Over time, the mature mulberry tree weakens and the new neighboring mustard bush tree increases and increases in size until it pushes enough ground around the mulberry toward the cliff edge, and then tumbles the mulberry tree down the steep slope to the sea's edge. Depending on the saturation of the sandy soil at the sea's edge, I can imagine the mulberry tree landing with its roots downward, and the root clump impacting and entering into the wettened beach soil. Now once transplanted, it stretches and re-roots itself into the soft soil below. (By rooting below the soi, the tree avoids absorbing the poisonous salty sea water, and from underneath, the sandy soil functions as a filter against the salt, so as to absorb fresh water, It begin here, its new chapter growing alongside the sea's shore. Over time the water rises and recedes, until one day, we look out and there is a tree growing, surrounded by water (like in marshy bayous where trees grow and thrive, even standing in surrounding water!) How could all this happen? Slowly and persistently, working away silently and diligently without notice. That is faith! And that is why Jesus continues on, in today's reading, to celebrate the role of a humble and committed servant. The servant works and completes his job because that is what good servants do! Not for recognition, not for reward, but only because that is their role!

Just like Jesus wishes us, to humbly and simply do our life's work (whatever that is and whatever He has assigned to us-our calling). Just faithfully do our work! Jesus certainly set the example. Recall that He says on Luk2 22:27 Jesus asks who is greater, the person seated at the table or the one standing and serving, and Jesus goes on to describe Himself, "I am among you as the one who serves" (similar to Mark 10:45, where Jesus says, "Son of Man came to serve, not to be served" & John 6:38 that He came "not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me"). Faith is not flashy or spectacular: It simply does its work, for God!
