WEEKLY THOUGHTS TRINITY SUNDAY MAY 30th 2021

Dear Friends, Welcome to the celebration of the Trinity Sunday- celebrated after the Pentecost Sunday. Let us be thankful to God for His providential care and goodness as well as the various gifts God gave us for the building up of the Body of Christ- the Church.

The role of the Spirit is basically to teach and remind us as disciples of Jesus to announce the Gospel to all nations beginning at our families. May the Holy Spirit continue to guide us on this noble task of making disciples as we do the Prophetic ministry to which we all share by virtue of our Baptism.

Today we celebrate the Trinity Sunday. This is the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity and a basic Doctrine of the Christian faith. It is basically understandable with the heart and faith other than with the mind.

It teaches us that there are Three distinct Persons in the One God sharing the same divine nature, co-equal and co-eternal. Jesus himself taught about this mystery; "He and his Father are one and will send the Holy Spirit to be with his disciples in the work of Evangelization. The Council Fathers of Nicaea 325 and Constantinople defined it as a Dogma of the Christian Faith.

There are many ways we invoke the Holy Trinity in particular at Prayer. Its common practice that all our Prayers in the Church begin in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit - Holy Trinity and end by glorifying the Holy Trinity- Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

All Sacraments are administered under the Authority of the Holy Trinity; we are baptized Confirmed, Anointed, our sins forgiven and our Marriages blessed, Deacons, Priests and Bishops ordained in the name of the Holy Trinity.

At the end of Mass, the priest blesses us in the name of the Blessed Trinity. We should all endeavor to live the Trinitarian relationship of love and unity in the family relationship of Father, mother and children because at Baptism we become children of God and members of God's Trinitarian family.

You have already heard and anticipated the changes taking us back to the pre-covid period. Let us continue to be cautious in the steps we take as we shift back to normalcy remembering that Covid is still with us.

We will celebrate Corpus Christi next Sunday. Have a great week!

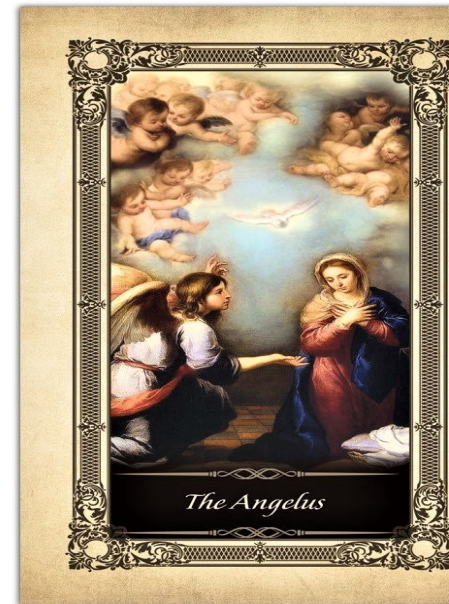
THE PARISHIONERS CORNER:
