Is it a Good Idea to Remodel September through December?

So, if you want your remodel completed before your first Holiday Party, now is a good time to schedule anything from an addition to a complete kitchen or bath makeover. You may find that a lot of good contractors are very busy this time of year—so start early because everyone else will have the same great idea you do "Remodel Now".



About Countertops

On any given day, your kitchen countertop may wind up playing the roles of cutting board, hot pad, office desk, food prep surface and snack bar. You need a surface that's durable, attractive and easy to clean. It's worth weighing the options carefully when you're remodeling. Top-notch tops are installed by pros only, but they have a look and feel no other material can match. When you're choosing countertops, here is some information that may help you find exactly what you need:

- Expect to spend 10 to 15 percent of your kitchen remodeling budget on countertops and installation. If you spend disproportionately more or less, you may wind up with tops that don't fit the look and feel of the rest of your kitchen.
- Quartz (engineered stone) countertops are very uniform and consistent so even though there are hundreds of styles and colors to choose from – the sample you see in the showroom will be what your countertop looks like. Quartz is nonporous and resistant to both stains and scratches and is extremely durable and never needs sealing or polishing.
- Granite If you want something more natural looking, granite might work but keep in mind that granite does not have a uniform pattern – it can come with striations and variations in the color and pattern. It is also softer and requires more upkeep and is more susceptible to stains and scratches. Price ranges run similar to Quarts if you're willing to commit to more maintenance; granite provides a unique-looking alternative. (HOUZZ-2016)

The smell of apples and pumpkin spice might be in the air, but it's fall recipes we're craving. These fresh autumn recipes feature the best of fall flavor and produce. Savory sides, fruity desserts, and all things warm and cozy combine to make us crave fall recipes like crazy. Plan your perfect fall menu this weekend, and dig in.

FRESH CRANBERRY RELISH

INGREDIENTS

2 C RAW CRANBERRIES 2 THICK CUT (PEELED) TART APPLES 1 LARGE SEEDLESS ORANGE SECTIONED 1–2 C GRANULATED SUGAR 2/3 C PECAN OR WALNUTS (optional)

DIRECTIONS

1 If you are using a food processor, be careful not to over-pulse or you'll have mush instead of relish.

You can also just chop very finely by hand, but that's difficult, especially with the cranberries.

2 Pulse the cranberries, orange sections, and apple slices in the food processor. Don't add the nuts, chop these separately and add at the end.

3 Stir in the sugar. (Start with less than a cup and keep adding 1/4 cups until you reach your desired level of sweetness.) Let sit at room temperature until the sugar dissolves, about 45 minutes. Store in the refrigerator until ready to use.

EASY PUMPKIN BREAD - YEILD 1 LOAF

INGREDIENTS 1/3 C VEGETABLE OIL 1 C CANNED PUMPKIN 3 EGGS 2 1/2 C BISQUICK 1 1/4 C SUGAR 2 TSP CINNAMON 1/2 C RAISINS—OPTIONAL

DIRECTIONS Heat oven to 350 degrees.

Generously grease bottom of 9x5 loaf pan.

Stir all ingredients except raisins in pan with fork until moistened; beat vigorously 1 minute. Stir in raisins. Bake until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 45 to 55 minutes. Cool 5 minutes. Run knife or metal spatula around sides of loaf to loosen; remove from pan. If loaf sticks to pan, press gently on sides

SPARKLING APPLE CIDER SANGRIA

INGREDIENTS 2 C APPLE CIDER

1/2 C COGNAC

- 2 APPLES, PEELED, CORRED AND CHOPPED
- SMALL
- 1/4 C POMEGRANATE SEEDS

ONE 750-ML BOTTLE SPARKLING DRY WHITE WINE

DIRECTIONS

Put the apple cider, cognac and apples in a large pitcher and stir to combine. Chill for at least an hour.

Stir most of the pomegranate seeds into the mixture, reserving a few for garnish. Pour in the cava. Pour the sangria into glasses and garnish each with a few pomegranate seeds.


Bring on the Perfect Baby Boomer Bath

The newest trend in bathroom design today favors a large walk-in shower over the garden tub/small shower combination. These were popular for a decade but homeowners soon realized that the garden/soaking tub was hardly used, was impossible to clean and was just wasted space. As a building/remodeling company we are having requests all the time for removing these large tubs in favor of large walk-in showers, more vanity or other storage space. The same holds true for the 55-plus market. Many conclude that the reason these buyers are skipping the tub is their fear of falling or difficulty getting in and out as they "age-in-place".

AKB has been designing and building spectacular showers large enough for two with multiple showerhead options that our customer love. They also find convenience in frameless glass enclosures and the feeling of space they provide. In many examples, the shower is so large, you don't need a door. However, you may prefer an enclosure that will trap in the steam and keep the shower warmer. Some homeowners have showers with showerheads at each end to ensure that each has the ideal height, water temperature, and spray intensity. You can also include heated shower floors and decorated niches—so that your toiletries aren't cluttering the floor walkway into the shower.

About the vanities. As experienced homeowners, many buyers understand the value of personal space. Separate vanities are simply good for aging couples. Now that we have jettisoned the grand tub, there is plenty of space for double or even separate vanities. If there is room still, consider a stackable vanity top with a sliding front where you can install a swing out lighted magnifying mirror, other small appliances, a charging station and more. When you want to cover it up, just slide the door closed. You may also want to also a window to brighten up the room. As we age, we need more light to see up close and natural light is ideal and even a stained glass, ice block or transom window will brighten up your bathroom.

Finally consider adding a few well placed handlebars. There are now so many selections to choose from that a strategically placed decorative bronze handlebar is a welcome addition that can add decorative detail to any bathroom and still provide support and safety.
