Sewing machines and sergers were humming and we produced well over 100 pillowcases during the day. Then, people brought more that they had made at home. In total, we have collected 190 pillowcases so far - which far exceeded our goal! Special thanks to the Charity committee (Barbara, Cathie, and Mary Anne) for all their prep and hard work and to all the folks that came to the workshop, brought in pillowcases, or shared snacks.

Our anniversary celebration and Color Collaboration challenge turnout was spectacular. Fifty-five people saw the grand reveal of our spectrum of quilts. Our display shows what happens when people come together with different techniques and talents to build a new and stronger unified whole. Thanks so much to our Program team (Anne and Laura), Hospitality committee (Donna) and for everyone who helped hang or clean up, brought food items, or participated in the challenge. Congratulations to all the winners! The beautiful handmade ribbons were made by Anne and Cathie. Carol has graciously offered to look for venues to show the challenge quilts as an exhibit for those who choose to participate. And then there was Shadfest! Seventeen members donated 21 posters, including two in memory of recently deceased local quilters. Sally Davis' piece "Ripple" won the award for best textile - what a lovely tribute to a great needlewoman. The bidding was fast and furious. Guild member posters raised \$3,465 for the Jim Hamilton Scholarship Fund. So much energy, fun, and kettle corn! Thanks to everyone who created posters, came to the Shadfest, posted pictures and videos, and bid on the wonderful pieces. As Amy would say, "it's all for the children."

Next month we have our UFO Auction at the <u>Marion Clawson Park</u> in the pavilion. All proceeds will be donated to Safe Harbor. Please take some time to clean out those projects and items that have just been sitting around for too long. Then encourage your friends to spend their money buying them. 
Bylaws/Standing Rules (Patty Gertz & Cass Garner)
