HEARING, SPEECH & OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCREENINGS

Classroom observations, ASQs, and parent requests are used to recommend a Speech or Occupational Therapy screening to help determine if a child's skills are age appropriate. BHPCNS works with experts in our area to conduct Speech and OT screenings twice a year and Vision and Hearing screenings once a year. These screenings are all provided at no additional cost to parents. BHPCNS feels strongly that early intervention can have an enormous positive impact on a child's immediate and long-term development.

The Speech and Occupational Therapy Screenings, while a snapshot in time, help BHPCNS identify whether a child's skills are age-appropriate, should be reassessed in 6 months, or should be examined more comprehensively. BHPCNS does not receive compensation for referrals made to outside organizations for more comprehensive assessments. We value the feedback from screenings and assessments and use this information to make adjustments to our programming to better meet the needs of every child in our program.





SCHOOL ROUTINES

Morning Drop-Off: Children are welcome in classrooms at 8:55am. Do not drop your child off before 8:55am as teachers are still preparing for the day.

Handwashing at Morning Drop-Off: All children are to be taken to the bathroom by a caregiver to have their hands washed upon arriving at school and before entering their classroom. This simple task cuts down on the transmission of germs and allergens and keeps everyone healthier.

Pick-up Times: Please be prompt when picking up your child at the end of the school day. We allow for a 10 minute grace period, but after that time, your child will be waiting in the office for you to pick them up. You may be charged a late fee if you are chronically late to pick up your child.

IMPORTANT KINDERGARTEN INFORMATION

MCPS Kindergarten Registration is Beginning March 18th

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall

PRE-WRITING SKILLS

From NAEYC, the National Association for the Education of Young Children, 4 Tips Every Kindergarten Teacher Wants You to Know

Pre-writing skills are the lines and strokes kids need to master and know BEFORE learning how to print the alphabet. Each of these lines are developed in a sequence, based on how old the child is.



- Vertical Line Age 2 imitates, age 3 copies/masters
- Horizontal Line Age 2 1/2 imitates, age 3 copies/masters
- Circle Shape Age 2 1/2 imitates, 3 copies/masters
- Cross Shape (+) Age 3 1/2 imitates, age 4 copies/masters
- Square Shape Age 4
- Right/Left Diagonal Line Age 4 1/2
- X Shape Age 5
- Triangle Age 5

Fun Ways to Work on Pre-Writing Skills

Since the typical age for children working on pre-writing lines is ages 2-5, it is a good idea to focus on fine motor skills that promote learning these lines and shapes instead of using paper and pencils/crayons. Your child will need the fine motor strength these activities provide in order to have good pre-writing lines and later good letter formations.

WINTER PICKS from our LIBRARIAN - Mrs. Hauck

Librarian Hauck reports:

March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb. Even though spring is just around the corner, we may still see snow. Several of our school library books beautifully illustrate the gradual transition from winter to spring.

So Much Snow by Kristen Schroeder – Lyrical text and sweet illustrations show several animals as a snowstorm slowly piles up from Monday to Sunday. The sun comes out and on the following Monday to Sunday, signs of spring gradually appear.

Goodbye Winter, Hello Spring by Kenard Pak –A boy and his dog enjoy a snowy winter night which gently transitions to a morning filled with signs of spring.

Hello Spring! by Shelley Rotner -- Simple text and beautiful photographs of nature illustrate the gradual shift from winter to spring.

Your children occasionally visit the library with their teachers and borrow a book to take home. Parents, grandparents, and caretakers are also welcome to visit the BHPCNS Library. Please see the office staff for assistance if you wish to borrow a book.

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Mrs. Goodstein

In March we are headed to the Farm and sing Old Mrs. Goodstein had a farm. E-I-E-I-O. The E-I-E-I-O is like a tongue twister for your fingers. We will see who can master it by the end of the song.

After we learn all the animals who live on the farm, we will head to the Zoo.

Animal signs are SO MUCH fun to learn!



ART (all ages) with Mrs. Mac 'N Cheese



In February, our artists will follow the ingenuity of Pablo Picasso and Georges Braque and try their hands at cubism. This form of art dates back to early 19th century bringing different views of objects or figures together in the same picture.

Our cubs will study an object from all sides and use sponges to create their masterpieces.

MUSIC (3-year-old & Pre-K) with Little Hands

We'll be reciting "Brownie's Dog House" (exploration of hand gestures and LOTS of "B" words!) Identifying words with the same beginning consonant, especially in the context of something familiar, is a great pre-literacy exercise for preschoolers. Look for this repeated initial consonant also in the alliterative names in the "Bow Wow Wow" song where "Tommy Tucker" and his friends, "Susie Summers," "Bobby Baker, " and more lose their dogs and are reunited at the end at the park ("after dark"). Rhyming is also a fun and helpful pre-literacy game to play with young children.

The well known and fun "This Old Man" (Knick Knack) song gives children a chance to practice counting AND rhyming, and more "rollling" home - a great hand gesture that connects both sides of the brain and body at the "midline!"



"This Old Man"

This old man, he played one. He played knick-knack on my thumb,

Two - shoe, three - knee, four-floor, five - high, six- like sticks, seven to heaven, eight like a gate, nine - all the time, ten - do it again!


