COVID Protocols

COVID Protocols have not changed or been updated since last spring. The COVID taskforce at the Diocese of Fresno will meet in September so we hope to hear from them then. All of our COVID protocols come straight from the Diocese Taskforce who meets to go over state and CDC updates and then disperses what we have to do and enforce as principals. I continue to ask for updates due to state mandates and protocols being updated regularly. Protocols from last spring are as follows:

Changes Regarding COVID-19 Protocols- Effective March 14, 2022

With the mask mandate lifted, effective March 14th, the Diocese of Fresno has also outlined protocols that our schools do not need to continue doing with regards to COVID-19. They are as follows.

1. Students will no longer need to wear masks at any time on campus. Parents can continue having their children wear masks if desired. Please communicate this to your child.
2. Temperature checks will no longer be taken upon entry. If a student complains of not feeling well, we will temp check
3. Our staff no longer needs to contact trace, however, must keep all prior records of contact tracing saved for 3 years.
4. Our staff no longer needs to send notifications of COVID due to parents not being mandated to report to our office.
 - a. With this change I continue to stress: If you child is not feeling well, **KEEP THEM HOME.**
 - b. Anyone presenting with COVID symptoms will still be immediately sent home, as we did before.
5. If we are informed that a child has tested positive, they must stay home for 5 days AND be symptom free before returning to school
6. Family members who are in contact with a COVID positive person in their home, we ask that they do not come to campus for 5 days
7. Sanitization (fogging, extra cleaning, wiping desks, etc.) are still in place. We will continue to keep our proactive safety measures in place.
8. Unvaccinated teachers will still have to test once a week, as we have been doing.
