"All these [commandments] I have kept since I was a boy,' he said. When Jesus heard this, he said to him, 'You still lack one thing. Sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he became very sad, because he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked at him and said, 'How hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God! Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God'" (Luke 18:21-25).

We all have limits, the human body can truly only do so much, but there is a difference between limiting yourself and your bodies limits. A lukewarm person will codify and qualify and condition how much they are willing to give. They do not want to give to help certain people or certain situations. They expect something in return. They claim to be too tired or too drained or too busy, when in reality they simply want to go and do something else. Jesus does not always ask us to give Him everything rather to be willing to give Him everything and on the occasions that He does ask for it, a lukewarm person will not be willing to give it. Are you someone who can and does go beyond the normal call of duty. Have you made sacrifices for Jesus or simply been inconvenienced by Him? This is the question you have to ask yourself when determining how on fire for Jesus you are. Lukewarm persons do not inspire faith, they struggle to bring others to faith and to make disciples of others because they are failing to disciple themselves. May we all be "on fire" Christians and allow the power of the Holy Spirit to work through us.

Trustees' Report

Although the Trustees did not meet in May, our work continues. Based on the discussion amongst the Trustees and feedback from the congregation, we've asked the architect to draw up plans for the following: cover the dirt floor under the sanctuary with concrete to prevent it from turning to mud when we have water in the basement; create a men's and a lady's handicapped accessible restroom in the area they were previously; construct the shell of what may be the kitchen in the future, with 'roughed in' plumbing; and renovate the restroom in the in the Chapel/Elm Street Lounge to make it handicapped acceptable. To make this restroom handicapped accessible the small kitchenette area will need to be reconfigured. Because we need to have a useable restroom, the logical progression of construction will be to construct the restrooms in the architect's plans before they are submitted to the Code Enforcement Officer for approval.

Ad Board

The Eastern Conference of the United Methodist Church (ECUMC) has published, on its web site, that, beginning July 1, 2016, "all prospective volunteers in PA who will have direct contact with minors in churches must provide, in advance, a child abuse clearance from the state Dept. of Human Services and a criminal background check from the State Police, both as required by the Child Protective Services Law." Normally the fees for each of those would be \$10, but ECUMC says that the state has announced that the \$10 fees will be waived for volunteers beginning July 25. These certifications are now state prerequisites for working with children, and they operate correlatively with the UMC Safe Sanctuaries policy. It means that our church's child-contacting volunteers must have the two state certifications *and also* go through UMC Safe Sanctuaries training, but there is relief in the form of the two state fee waivers after July 25. We will continue to watch for further information.

By Board approval, Bethany will close its doors on Sunday, June 19 while the outdoor combined-church community service / picnic is going on at Milton's Brown Avenue Park (10:30 AM start). This will allow any and all of our church members to attend that special event. Pastor Damien will be the presiding clergyperson at Brown Avenue, and our own Karen Heimbach and Calvin Hoffman will provide the music for the occasion.

PSPRC has created a Vacation Request Form and a Pay Issuance Timing Schedule for the use and benefit of our paid employees and our Treasurer.

Note: There will **not** be a meeting in June for Finance and Ad Board, due to VBS. Finance and Ad Board will resume in July.
