(The Kansas City Area Council, or KCAC, which meets quarterly, provides an opportunity for face-to-face connections between members in the Chapters and Express Networks that have membership in the Council, which we do.)

KCAC is seeking board members for the 2026 year. A great way to develop or increase your skills while working with members from other leagues! The Council only has 4 events a year. Delegates will vote on November 1!

The high-level descriptions:

CHAIR: The authorized leader of the Council. The chair maintains unity and harmony within the Council and directs officers, committees and members toward common goals. Works with the Board to plan yearly goals, projects, activities and budget for the Council.

VICE CHAIR: The Council host and primary assistant to the Chair, assumes all duties and responsibilities of the Chair in her absence or when called upon by the Chair, and welcomes members and guests at Council functions.

COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER: The transcriber of the Council meeting minutes, correspondence, and promotion of events to be distributed to the Council delegates and member Leagues; conducts general correspondence for the Council.

FINANCIAL OFFICER: responsible for all Council money and is custodian of the financial records. She advises the Council regarding finances and budget matters and prepares a formal budget for the Council, providing monthly or quarterly updates.
