

LLOYD F. REIMANN

1916 - 1982

Lloyd F. Reimann, age 66, co-founder of the Reimann-Snyder Furniture Company of Bad Axe and Pigeon, passed away Tuesday, Sept. 6 at Huron Memorial Hospital, near Bad Axe, following a brief illness.

He was born July 2, 1916 in Lincoln Township near Fillion, son of the late William and Florence (Gay) Reimann. He attended Kinde High School and was a member of the Port Huron Business College Class of 1935.

He and Eva Gilbert were married March 30, 1940 at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Kinde. The couple lived at Port Huron where he worked as a bookkeeper for the former Lambert Coal Company and the Aikman Bread Company.

On Dec. 7, 1947, he and John Snyder formed the Reimann-Snyder Furniture Company. He worked at the firm until his retirement in 1979. The company has stores in Pigeon and Bad Axe.

Reimann was past president of the Bad Axe Lions Club and had a perfect attendance record for 24 years. He was a member of Verona Hills Golf and Country Club. He was past president of the Bad Axe Chamber of Commerce and Upper Thumb Gem and Mineral Society, a former board member of the Michigan Floor Covering Association and a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church, Bad Axe, where he served as elder and president of the church board.

Surviving are his wife, Eva; one son, William Reimann, Bad Axe; two daughters, Mrs. Robert (Susan) Brueggeman, Pigeon and Mrs. Michael (Gretchen) Carroll, Frankenmuth; five grandchildren; three brothers, Orrie Reimann, Kingston, Alfred Reimann and Deward Reimann, both of Fillion and two sisters, Mrs. John (Florence) Snyder, Bad Axe and Mrs. Howard (Leona) Breen, Traverse City, and several nieces and nephews.

One brother, Wilfred, preceded him in death.

Services were conducted Friday, Sept. 10 at Our Savior Lutheran Church. The Rev. Roger Heintz, pastor officiated with burial in Colfax Cemetery.
