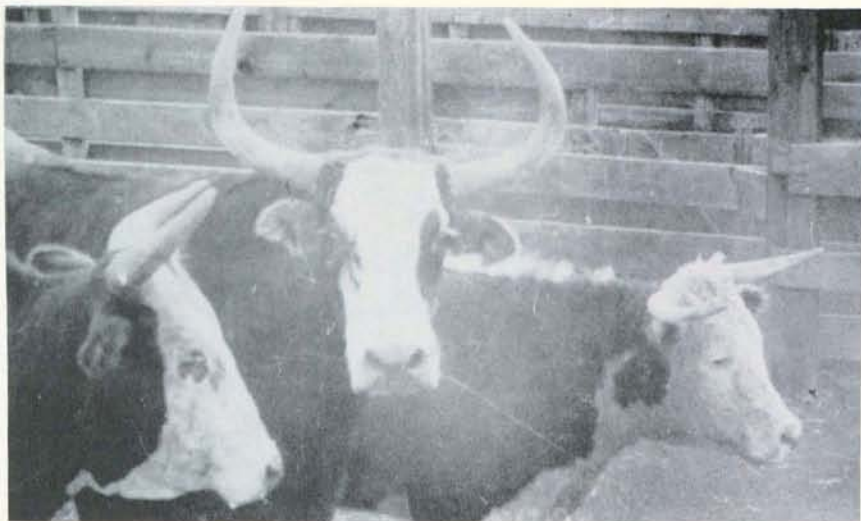

In presenting the 1958-59 STEER annual, we have tried to include a little of the old, as well as the new - historical as well as the present-day events. Here we present two pictures of Magdalena: one taken fifty years ago, in 1909, and one taken this year, in 1959. The town has changed; the school has changed; but the progress of the area is very evident in these two pictures. Perhaps you can identify several of the buildings that still remain; perhaps several have been torn down, but the Magdalena Mountain still stands guard over the inhabitants.

We have been unable to determine just where the 1909 picture was taken, but the picture taken this year was gathered from the top of the Santa Fe water storage tower, located near the stock yards. A series of six pictures had to be taken and then glued together - we still haven't figured out how the entire picture was made in 1909, unless it was taken with a wide angle lense, which we didn't have. One thing that we did have was the use of the long ladders of the Magdalena Fire Department to close the thirteen foot space from the ground to the ladder of the tower.

History is always in the making, and the Magdalena area is rich in traditions and legacies and we have attempted to record the events of this school year as we have seen them through the eyes of the camera. Our staff of five photographers tried to cover each and every event of the school as well as they could. As you thumb through this book now and ten years from now, we hope that you will be able to recall sections of the good times you have had this year, and also your friends.

That was our objective - our plan. We hope that we have succeeded.

Andy Candelaria, after four years of college, is the most skilled ditch digger of the North Western part of New Mexico.

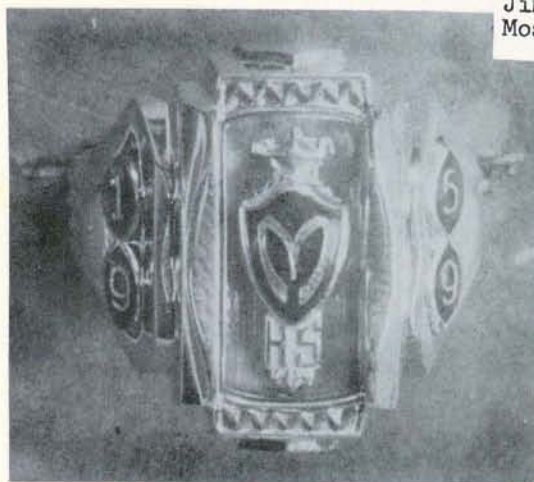

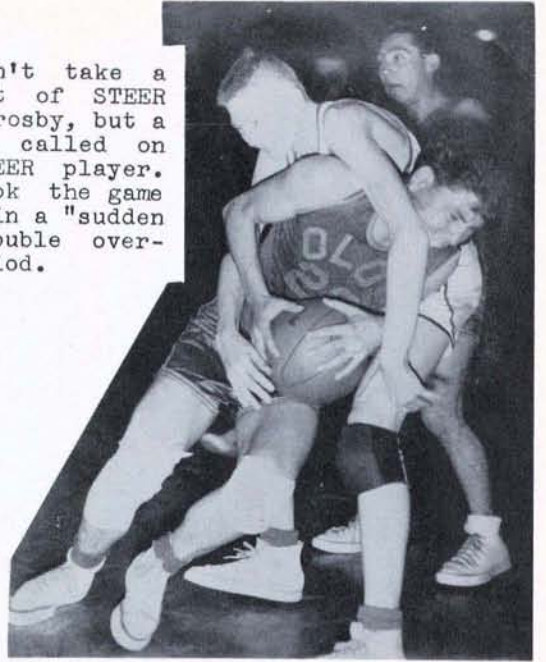

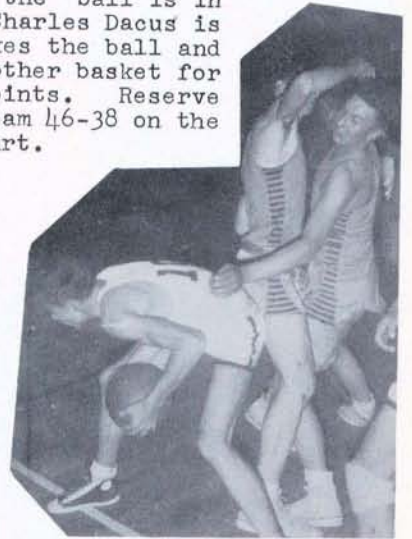

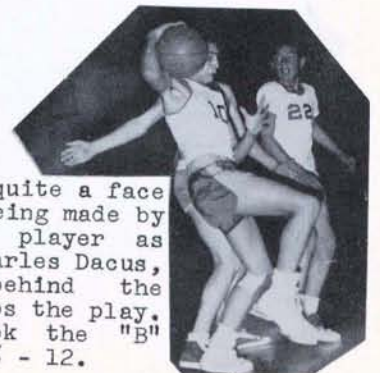
