One thing that we did have was the use of the long ladders of the Magdalena Fire Department to close the thirteen foot space from the ground to the ladder of the tower.

History is always in the making, and the Magdalena area is rich in traditions and legacies and we have attempted to record the events of this school year as we have seen them through the eyes of the camera. Our staff of five photographers tried to cover each and every event of the school as well as they could. As you thumb through this book now and ten years from now, we hope that you will be able to recall sections of the good times you have had this year, and also your friends.

That was our objective - our plan. We hope that we have succeeded.
