

Good morning!

Take a look at a play involving the last free throw [here](#).

So interesting play, huh? We have white shooting a free throw, blue violates and white commits a common foul, and white's free throw does not go in (of course it doesn't!). So, how do we resume play?

There is a lot going on here and several rules must be applied! The delayed violation on blue does not end the free throw attempt (rule 9-1-3d penalty b). The foul on white does not make the ball dead since the free throw has been released (6-7-7 exception b). Since the violation and foul occurred before the free throw had ended, we penalize both!

White missed the free throw so will get a substitute free throw *with nobody on the lane lines* because the foul will have a penalty that will resume live play. In this particular case, blue is not in the bonus, so will get the ball due to the foul on white. Since it would not matter who had rebounded a substitute free throw we shoot it *with nobody on the lane lines*. IF blue had been in the bonus, we still would have shot the substitute free throw *with nobody on the lane lines* then gone to blues end and the blue player fouled (#24????) would shoot two free throws *with everyone on the lanes lines* since we would play off the result of the second free throw (rebound on a miss or white ball OOB on a make).

Really interesting play! When something like this happens, slow down and talk to your partner(s)! Send the players to their benches to make sure nothing crazy happens when we are talking!
