Shipwrecked, Yet Joyful

Recently I received an email devotional from BibleGateway, written by John Piper, entitled Fifteen Tactics for Joy, based on Psalm 15:11. "You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore." Then he asked the question, "How shall we fight for joy?" Following are his fifteen tactics.

- 1. Realize that authentic joy in God is a gift.
- 2. Realize that joy must be fought for relentlessly.
- 3. Resolve to attack all known sin in your life.
- 4. Learn the secret of gutsy guilt how to fight like a justified sinner.
- 5. Realize that the battle is primarily a fight to see God for who he is.
- 6. Meditate on the Word of God day and night.
- 7. Pray earnestly and continually for open heart-eyes and an inclination for God.
- 8. Learn to preach to yourself rather than listen to yourself.
- 9. Spend time with God-saturated people who help you see God and fight the fight.
- 10. Be patient in the night of God's seeming absence.
- 11. Get the rest, exercise, and proper diet that your body was designed by God to have.
- 12. Make a proper use of God's revelation in nature.
- 13. Read great books about God and biographies of great saints.
- 14. Do the hard and loving thing for the sake of others (witness and mercy).
- 15. Get a global vision for the cause of Christ and pour yourself out for the unreached.


As I studied lesson eleven in our current Baptist Expositor (Safe in the Storm), taken from the 27th chapter of Acts, I considered that it could just as easily been titled, Shipwrecked, Yet Joyful.

Our theme this year is "Shipwrecked", and although we may not literally be shipwrecked as Paul was in this passage, we often times face the same obstacles.

- Sometimes we wait until past the optimal time to accomplish a task.
- Sometimes we base our actions on the advice of others, instead of depending on God.
- Sometimes we lighten our load by throwing away precious cargo.
- Sometimes we give up hope.
- Sometimes we forget that God is in control all the time.
- Sometimes we forget that our health is important.
- Sometimes we need to abandon what we are relying on.

Remember what the first three verses of Psalm 121 tells us: I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your foot be moved, he who keeps you will not slumber. Our God is never asleep on the job. He never slumbers. He works tirelessly for us, as we worship him through obedience. What should we do? We should look to Him. We should preach to ourselves the promises of God. We should really, really believe that every word, every promise, in scripture is true, and we should fight for joy!

Cornhole Tournament

Cornhole is the perfect game for the no frills, no sweat summertime athlete. Determine the MVPs in your church with a laid-back tournament. Borrow boards from church members and be sure to serve concessions. You could charge a small entrance fee to the event with a cake or pie for the champion.

Home Run Derby

Players are given a time limit to hit as many homeruns as possible. The players with the most can then be put head-to-head for a grand finale. You can charge people to enter the competition and offer a prize for the winning hitter. As you change out hitters have your volunteer "outfielders" (little ball players) to pickup all the balls on the ground and run them back to home plate.

Just make sure you have a wide-open space available and you have picked a day with great weather. Make this a church picnic day. Prize for top hitter could be a box of cracker jacks or a large bottle of coke and popcorn. Little ball players win an ice pop for grounding the balls.
