Recycled tea bags have become beautiful art, using watercolor, inks and collage paper. They are applied to journal pages, greeting cards or canvas boards as miniature masterpieces. The art lends itself well to a nature look. You can see examples of Tea Bag Art on Google or Pinterest.

Supplies to bring:

- Dried used tea bags (Dry the bag with tea inside) (Using black tea or Earl Gray, stains the bag better)
- Watercolors & small brushes
- Old brush for applying liquid adhesive lnk pens
- Scissors Card stock or your art journal
- Teacher will supply collage materials and Mod Podge
