**RESOLUTION NO.: SL - 50 - 2025** 

TITLE: APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR A FY 2026 USFWS PARTNER FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE PROGRAM GRANT TO BENEFIT LCT SPAWNING, WILDLIFE MOVEMENT, AND WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS

- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe is organized pursuant to Section 16 of Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) as amended, with the Articles of Association, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 8, 1965, granting certain powers to the Summit Lake Paiute Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has the responsibility for the general welfare of its tribal membership including tribal natural resources; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council is the duly constituted governing body within the Summit Lake Paiute Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has been organized to represent, develop, protect, and advance the views, interest, education, resources, and general welfare of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe membership; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council supports natural resources management that protects, conserves, and enhances plants and wildlife native to the Summit Lake basin and aboriginal area of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Council has organized a Natural Resources
  Department (NRD) to provide technical expertise and services to
  manage air, water, soil, fish, wildlife, and plants within the Summit Lake
  Paiute Reservation and off Reservation areas considered the aboriginal
  homeland of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Department respectfully requests permission to apply for a FY25 United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)

  Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program Grant to improve LCT spawning habitat by depositing spawning gravels in lower Mahogany Creek, improve the movement of wildlife along Mahogany Creek by removing fencing that is not wildlife friendly, and improve wildfire preparedness by replacing aging components on the emergency water storage tanks; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Summit Lake Paiute Council hereby approves to apply for a US Fish and Wildlife Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program grant for the projects described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Summit Lake Paiute Council does not waive, alter, or otherwise diminish its Sovereign Immunity, whether expressed or implied, by virtue of this grant contract for any and all administrative or legal action which may arise directly or indirectly from the same. Furthermore, the Summit Lake Paiute Council hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairwoman to execute any instruments as may be necessary and appropriate to accomplish the above-mentioned actions in the name of and on behalf of the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe.
