





Interested persons can walk-in any time during those hours; there may be on a first-come, first-served basis.



Taxpayers should bring proof of Identification (photo ID); Social Security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for you, your spouse, and/or dependents; proof of damaged items. birthdates for all on the tax return; for married filing jointly, both spouses must be present; all Forms W-2, W-2G, federal and state returns; proof of bank account and routing information if choosing direct deposit of refund (e.g. voided check); total paid to daycare provider and their tax ID; health ceived; and all Forms 1095 Health Insurance statements. mchair Travels:


