Our Membership Director Roberta Butek was also present. Members in attendance, Dale Pomerleau, Jerry Schilling and Tom Owens and Phil Zins. Our President, Jerome Bokelmann called the meeting to order and

conducted the board meeting in accordance with his duties to meet with the board in the monthly scheduled meeting. Secretary's report: Our President asked if there were any corrections or additions to the report for the September printed copy of the minutes. A motion was made by Thom Boche to accept the September minutes as printed in the Aoogah Newsletter in October. The motion was then seconded by Scott Huberty. A vote was taken, and it passed unanimously.

Treasures report:

Doug Portlance, our treasurer ran thru the September month's activities with a spreadsheet provided for those present for this month's bank and expense activity. After running thru the accounting for the month a question was asked by Scott Huberty regarding the interest that we are gaining each month on our bank balance. He asked why we are not seeking a higher interest return than we are presently receiving. Various members of the board voiced their view on the this. The responses were, a member of the board would be very hesitant to create and file a tax return on behalf of the club as the investments required to get a higher rate of interest would generate a document that would require a tax return. Several board members said they would not consider being on the board if it would require their signature. Other members stated that should we need to seek the services of a professional (an accountant or attorney) should we need to reply to an inquiry from the IRS or state department of revenue those fees could be much more than the gain in additional funds received thru investing. Other comments made were that the club is presently in very good financial standing, and the additional income would not influence the expansion of our budget or change how we look to wisely spend our funds. The club is easily living within its means with the collection of dues, donations, fundraiser and the generosity of support from some of its members.

A motion was made by Scott Hubety to accept the report as presented, a second was made by Marc Rude, there were no further questions, and the vote was unanimous and passed.

Membership report: Roberta Butek told us that there were no new applications to consider for membership. She told us there are already two members have sent in early renewals for 2025 and that we have somewhere between 240 - 250 family memberships at this time.

Freight of the prize is the responsibility of the winner. Raffle tickets will be priced at \$5.00 per ticket or bulk purchase discount of 5 tickets for \$20.00. Drawing for the brake drums will take place at the election banquet. The value of this donation is in excess of \$700.00.



Jim's Tech Tips Pleated Paper Fuel Filter Elements

Ford originally used a fine mesh brass screen at the top of the glass fuel strainer bowl that's mounted to the Model A firewall. The bowl gives a place for water to settle into (water is heavier than gasoline) and a place for dirt and rust particles to collect.

The screen also keeps these particles from traveling down to the carburetor (where you have another screen!). With all these screens, I think Ford knew that gasoline supplies at the time were prone to contamination (more than today).



Many people have started to install a

small pleated paper filter element in the glass bowl instead of the brass screen.

I'm not so sure it's needed; I think the brass screen is enough. The Model A has no fuel pump, it relies only on gravity feed, and I'm concerned about adding another restriction to the fuel flow.

But IF you use one of these paper filters, you need to know that the rust, dirt, etc. is trapped INSIDE the paper element, not on the outside of it like you'd think. Therefore, you can be collecting a lot junk inside the filter, plugging up the filter element on the inside, and not even know it. One day, you lose all your power and



the engine really acts like it is starving for fuel. You thought you would see the rust and dirt collect on the outside of the filter... but you don't. Surprise! (I hate surprises!)

So, if you are going to use these pleated paper filters, get into the habit of replacing them regularly, maybe once a year, since you can't see how dirty they are inside. And carry a spare filter and gasket with you in the car. It's a pretty easy thing to swap out in a parking lot. Kind of messy, but it can be done without tools. Use some disposable gloves and you won't smell like gas for the rest of the day.

That's all for now. Keep driving, help each other out, and Have a Model A Day! Jim




