When we are given to understand this reality, we certainly would no longer need a Directory that would impose the proper behaviour on us. If we have need of that, then it is because of the hardness of our hearts. The highest norm, and therefore the most demanding, is the reality itself of the Eucharistic celebration, which selects words, gestures, feelings that will make us understand whether or not our use of these are at the level of the reality they serve. It is obvious that this cannot be improvised. It is an art. It requires application on the part of the priest, an assiduous tending to the fire of the love of the Lord that he came to ignite.(Desiderio#57)

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

6th Sunday Easter Year A

John 14:15-21

Did you ever watch the 'Romper Room' Kids show? It was an Australian style kid's show much like our Mr Roger's Neighborhood. The host Nancy ended every show with a Magic Mirror segment, where she would claim to see and include all of the children watching from home. She'd say, "Magic Mirror, tell me today, did all of our friends have fun at play? Oh, I see Michael had a special day, and Jenny had a special day Sunday, and I see Olivia and Teresa, and......" Maybe through the mail she received letters from little fans wishing to be named and included in the show, too. The point of the Magic Mirror was to let all of the children know that they were not alone - the televising of the show ensured that so many more kids were involved than could ever be seen on the small TV studio set. Such an idea of inclusion and continuing contact even when not physically in the same room together with someone, is kind of what Jesus suggests to His disciples in today's reading. He says, "In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me....." (Jn 14:19). Though others may not see Him, his disciples will still see Him by Faith, by the Holy Spirit. Jesus had said to them, "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you" (Jn 14:18). Of course, the Holy Spirit given to them by the Father and Son-Jesus is who will affirm within them the presence of Jesus. He had told them that the Holy Spirit would come to them (Jn 14:16-17). The Spirit is also called the - "Advocate" ('Ad-Vocate' means literally 'someone called to one's side'). This Advocate (someone beside you to guide you) affirms to the disciples in their souls, that Jesus is with them still. The Spirit enables the disciples to still see Jesus by faith even when the world cannot see Him. The Holy Spirit does that: He confirms within us the 'Presence of Jesus'. Jesus says that we will still know Him in our lives (that He will be with us – even when others do not see/know Him) when he taught in John 14:26 that the Spirit will "teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you". And then again in John 16:14 when Jesus said that "the Spirit will take from what is mine and declare it to you." Some people think of this experience of the Spirit 'reminding us of Jesus', and 'declaring again to us what Jesus had already said' as similar to when we are told/taught something, but only later in a practical application of such words, that then we see/feel its real impact (Oh, that is what He was talking about!- like hearing "Be careful that plate is hot, so we touch it and say 'Oh yeah, it is hot!') The Spirit reinforces or infuses again into us, the 'Presence of Jesus'. The Spirit lets us say later, "Okay, now I am feeling you Jesus"!

All of the talk from Jesus about the Advocate-Holy Spirit being sent is a good introduction to what we will celebrate in three weeks on Trinity Sunday. That day (more on it then) is a great time to reflect upon who God is to us (A divine Trinity of Persons). Jesus promises His disciples that they know He is with them always (Matt 28:20) by the Spirit's working in them. The unity of persons in God the Trinity (Father-Son-Spirit) is consistently taught by Jesus. So often, Jesus spoke of the union shared by the Father and Son ('The Father and I are one' Jn 17:21 & Jn 10:30) and following such language, Jesus adds that the Coming Spirit after His ascension, that Spirit would confirm, guard and guide the disciples in His Name (Jn16:13, 14:17). So, it is the Holy Spirit Itself, that reveals such belief and motivates actual practice of Trinitarian Life (Union with God, Unity among His disciples).

I like how Jesus reminds us that His Believing Disciples will see Him, even when others do not see Him. Because we know there were times when even the disciples themselves are with Jesus and *don't realize it IS Him*. For example, Mary Magdalene in the Tomb Garden (Jn 20), the Two Disciples on the road to Emmaus (Lk 24) and the apostles on the seashore fishing (Jn 21) don't recognize/see Jesus at first look. But after encountering Jesus Risen from the dead, they get better (stronger faith, stronger vision) at seeing/spotting Him, or feeling His Presence even when the eye alone doesn't see anything. Faith accomplishes that – It always sees more. St Paul says it this way in 2 Corinthians 5:7 "We walk by faith, not by sight". In Romans 8:24, St Paul tells us that "hope that sees for itself is not hope. For who hopes for what one sees?" And Hebrews 11:1 adds that "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." So, even if the world doesn't see Jesus, we His followers do see Him and it is our mission to help others come to faith, and help them come to see more of Jesus in their lives and in the world around them. Jesus is all around us here, and faith always discovers Him! Peace, Fr Brian
