



29th Rallye Aïcha des Gazelles

More than 1000 people gathered in the marquee tent in Essaouira, Morocco to ring out the 29th Rallye Aïcha des Gazelles in style. A total of 165 teams participated in the 29th edition of this one-of-a-kind adventure.

It is the world's first international off-road Rally race for women only.

Since 1990, it has brought together women between the ages of 18 and 71, from 30+ countries, who embark on an adventure of a lifetime from the French city of Nice and onward to the start of the Rallye in the Moroccan desert. Created in 1990, the Rallye Aïcha des Gazelles has been creating a new vision of automobile competition: no speed and no GPS, just old-fashioned navigation, completely off-road—a return to the roots of adventure. The only requirement is determination.
