I haven't written much lately, so here's a recap on this summer's trips to the beach.

It started off early in the year, Rich Jenkins and myself hitting the beach above Ventura. The sand crabs were thick and easy to get. He caught his first Corbina and we whip-led some perch to end the day. I fished Bolsa Chica several times and caught many smaller grade Corbinas, yellowfin croakers, smelt, and even two small spotted bay bass. The big boys eluded me so far, until this morning. Tuesday night on the spur of the moment I get my gear ready for the morning bite. Daybreak (8:00 a.m.) I'm setting up my gear on the tailgate of my truck, I don't see my digital scale in the tackle bag. Thinking to myself, I'm going to catch a big fish and no way to weigh it, this sucks. Down at water's edge I'm using my deep fry basket, aka sand crab scooper to get all different size crabs to last me the morning, about 30 or so. The waters kind of dirty with some weeds mixed but fishable. It was a full moon last night but the waves were somewhat small to medium. About a half hour into it, I feel a take on the end of the line. It feels like a heavy fish after setting the hook. It moves back and forth in the surf taking drag, but not long runs like a corbina would. After several minutes I'm getting it closer in and I see this tail the size of broom and a big wide body. There's no one around to see this! Back and forth, we fight it out. Finally, I drag it up on the sand, it's a spotting croaker all of 4 1/2 pounds and then some, maybe 5 pounds. No scale, no picture, no proof. Oh well it was fun any, just the one fish for the day. See you at the meeting. Thanks for reading this, Mike Maurizio.

Island Tak Trip By Alexander Perez

Henry, Ron and I arrived at Channel Island Oxnard at Cisco's Landing around 9:30pm wed night before our fishing trip on the Island Tac. As we exited our car we walked down to the landing carrying some of our food and gear towards the dock where the Island tac was parked. We Put down our gear and went below and got our bunks. Went back up to the car and unloaded the rest of our fishing gear and brought them onto the boat. The weather was a bit cool and very calm for a September evening there was hardly any clouds very nice. This was my friend from work henrys first fishing trip on a boat and he had been looking forward to going fishing with me for some time. I wanted him to have a good time and I checked my

fishing gear was ready. On wed night I gave him a quick in service on fishing, the basics 101 how to properly hold the fishing rod and reel, casting a conventional rod and reel to how to properly select and to hook on a live sardine. The drive was really calm and we arrived at the island around 7am. It was very foggy and cool. Captain John found a spot and finally stopped the boat and we started fishing it was a bit slow, so we moved and decided to try another spot after a 15-minute drive we stopped and I casted out my rod and let the bait swim it was all flyline fishing style.

It was here that I was able to land the 1st fish was an 8lb yellowtail. Throughout the day there were many boils of fish Bonita, yellowtails around the boat and many club members missed or loss several hookups seemed like these yellows would just bite the bait and let go kind of strange. All of a sudden somebody said there's a biter I looked around to the stern and it was Henry now its his turn he was on a fish. The reel peeled off line and the pole was bent, I watch him with a smile and a laugh how he struggled to properly hold the reel and rod and maneuvered his body to gain the advantage in order to win this fight. All the while I thought to myself this is why I go fishing. There were several other anglers who got yellowtails, bonito, nice calico bass, whitefish, perch a mix of fish. It seemed like again numerous flurry's boils of fish almost at every spot but then the bite would shut off.

I baited and casted out my rod, henry needed a hook so i handed him my rod and as i tied on a hook for him within a minute he again got bit and was on another fish on my rod. I could tell pole bent line peeling off the reel this was another nice fish as he again was quickly but calmly moving to gain the upper hand to tire out and to bring in this fish. Still makes me laugh just to think here's Henry who has never been fishing on a boat. He doesn't even own a pole, reel, rod or fishing license. Can barely throw out cast out 10ft or less and goes fishing with me on a boat and ends up with 2 yellowtails for the day and oh yea I forgot wins the jackpot thank you Henry for another great day of fishing.
