This year there were 74 3rd grade students. After our lunch with the students, we met with the new associate principal Mr Janssen, who came from an inner city school previously, along with Mrs McArthur, Dean of students who has been with Nicolet Elementary for 23 years. Teachers Rebekah Taylor, Ashley Brede & Marco Guillen also met with us. Nicolet happens to be one of the lowest socially economic schools in Green Bay school district. Many challenges are getting parent involvement and ICE adds additional challenges. Transition with students is down from past years, which is a big positive. There are 450 kids at school and currently, and there are two planned family nights for

the school. Students & staff who go above and beyond can earn “Lion Bucks”, and one of the students who earned their latest “Lion Bucks” were eager to show Vince & Nancy.
