

From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

Years ago I heard a sermon entitled "Sunday is Coming". The pastor spoke on all of the happenings of Holy Week and the passion of Christ. The great range of emotions and the understandings of the people during the last week of Christ's life.

The range starts with the disciples advising Christ not to go to Jerusalem to the entering of the city in what we now know as Palm Sunday. The cleansing of the temple, the testing of Christ by the Pharisees, the Passover feast, the betrayal, the arrest, the trail, the crucifixion, and burial and the loneliness of Saturday.

It was a very busy week but as Christians, we know that Sunday is coming! In the midst of all of the unknown, we need to focus on what we do know. At sometime in our life, we are going to face the uncertainty of what is going to happen next. Each day will bring a new and different perspective of how much more can we stand. I do believe the only thing that kept Christ going was his focus on what was the love of the father to guide and protect him.

Our focus should be the same, we should focus on the promises of God and remember we are never alone no matter how lonely we feel. We have the focus of Easter as our guide.

It appears that we have forgotten the first part of loving God. We have been led to believe that because God loves us we can do anything we want without consequences.

Many may think I have a long list of what I am against, my belief is more based on what I am for. I am for the truth contained within the Bible and that we will be held accountable for our words and action either for or against the word of God.

There is a lot of talking going on about what the future of the church will be. For me, I am going to focus that Sunday is coming and God's will is going to be done. There may be some difficult times ahead and some decisions that will be needed to be made but the church of Christ will rise again and new life will begin. I pray you and I will be there to celebrate that greatest of all Easter blessings when Christ reappears and calls all his followers to join him in the greatest worship service we will ever attend.

In case you haven't heard, the Borough of Milton has received a grant for a 'streetscape' project on Front Street from Broadway to Mahoning. Like the recent project on Broadway, there will be new sidewalks with a brick feature, new handicapped accessible curb cuts at the intersections, and new lighting and trees. The property owners affected were invited to stop by the Borough Office to review the project plans. Mike and Rod took advantage of the offer and were very impressed! According to the plans, in front of our church will be new sidewalk, a new street light and a tree. We were asked to sign a letter giving our permission for access to the property and approval for the project, which we did. It's anticipated the work will start very soon, maybe even before this newsletter goes to print, and be wrapped up in August. We assume there will be a period of time at some point during the project when the Front Street entrances will not be accessible. As we get more information we will pass it along.

Ad Board Report

Trinity and Christ Evangelical Lutheran Churches will both join Bethany to conduct VBS 2018. Great news.

We are extremely pleased that when we open our church to visitors during the April 28 – 29 series of local events, Merle Nicholas and Karen Heimbach will be playing together on Bethany's keyboard instruments. Additionally, our church will have free hot dogs and drinks available.

The Board has unanimously approved of Bethany joining in the financial support of the Milton Ministerium. This will help the organization in its growing multi-denominational efforts to benefit our community.

Pastor Bill described to the Board the most recent decisions by the Council of Bishops in connection with the United Methodist Commission on the denomination's "Way Forward". It now appears that UM churches will be offered two options for the future where matters of social impact are concerned. But neither involves strictly enforcing the Book of Discipline (BOD). Pastor, however, offers another possibility, that of Bethany joining the Wesley Covenant Association (WCA), which is an organization that brings together UMC's that have the common desire to strictly adhere to the BOD as written and enforce its stipulations wherever necessary. The Board will obtain more information on the WCA.




