From Pastor Bill's Study

Greetings to all,

I was recently reading an article about the church and it stated that in order for the church to grow larger, the people had to grow smaller. With the way I think, that is like saying in order to look taller you should hang around with shorter people.

However, the lead-in line of 'growing smaller' did raise my interest so I read on. It talked about how, in order to build up the church, we are to come to the understanding that the congregation is not the driving force present. Instead, it is to be the Holy Spirit guiding us to achieve grander goals than we as mere humans can even imagine.

We must take on the role of the humble servant. We must take up our bowl and cloth and be ready to serve where we are needed just as Christ demonstrated in John 13; the account of Jesus washing the disciples' feet before they shared their last Passover meal together.

Reading the article also triggered a memory from long ago when I read a story that talked about "Worm Training". The author spoke in reference to the line in Psalm 22:6, "But I am a worm, and not a man, scorned by men and despised by the people." (NIV)

This psalm, written by David, speaks to the misery David felt over his rejection by the people; and what he [wrongly] believed was his rejection by God. He went from greatness and high standing to being despised, ridiculed and event hunted. In the psalm David quickly discovers that he can accomplish nothing in his own power, but only through the power of God can the situation be changed.

On July 1st I will officially begin my appointment to the position of Pastor for Bethany UMC. If I am to be successful here I must first recognize that it is only through God and the Holy Spirit that anything can be accomplished. If I try to have it be my own plan it will fail. For if and when I try to work from my own perceived power or ability, it will very soon become evident as that idea, though it may grow quickly, will also die quickly, and without bearing fruit. Only when an idea or vision is born of the Holy Spirit, grown in the care of Christ and bearing fruit from God will it last and prosper.

With that thought in mind, I must become like John the Baptist. I know that Jesus must become greater, and I must become less. My role is to point the way to Christ, not to become Christ. I am to proclaim the crucified, dead, buried, and risen Christ as told in the Gospels. I am called to be an interpreter of God's word provided in the Bible and not a re-writer of the messages it contains. I am called to become a lowly worm!

I firmly believe that God has called me to Bethany for a purpose. I seek your affirmation of this calling to fulfill His purpose of lifting up and proclaiming the message of God's love for us through His son Jesus Christ.

I pray we will go through "Worm Training" together and will become a church that is focused on how big our God is, and how, through God, we can become the church we are called to be. We must become smaller as individuals, as a church, as a community of believers, so that God can be revealed in the true realm in which His power and majesty reins.

In order to become bigger, we must become smaller. It is the only way to reach our full potential and live as God calls us to live.

Trustees' Report.....

As mentioned last month, the renovations in the church are almost complete. The kitchen equipment was installed in the middle of June. As of this writing, the plumbing needs hooked up to the new sinks and the electrical work needs finished. It will be great to have a usable kitchen again! We are anticipating the installation of the new stair treads and flooring inside the Center Street entrance soon, which should finish off all ongoing renovation projects in the church.

The renovations to the interior of the Parish House continue to move along nicely. Installation of the new heating and air conditioning system is moving along. The 'front office' and the 'middle room' are now complete. All desks and equipment were moved into this space so that the office that's been used for many years could be renovated. New flooring is being installed in the vestibule and the new restroom. As mentioned previously, at the conclusion of the project, the pastor will have his own office and the other staff will have much more space to do their work.

We are busy getting the parsonage ready for Pastor Bill and his family. Now that Pastor Damien's belonging have been moved out, the interior of the house will be painted and cleaned. Because we don't think it's ever been done before, the internal ductwork will be cleaned prior to our new residents moving in.

Ad Board Report

The Board used its June 20 meeting time to discuss matters pertaining to the church budget, which is being affected by the imminent change in our pastoral leadership, by the recent departure of our Music Director, and by recent developments in matters of cash flow.

Other influences are the state and future of our Contemporary worship service and the financial commitments resulting from the projects that are taking place around the church, the Parish House, and the parsonage.

Recognizing that incoming Pastor McNeal needs time to get to know the details of our fiscal methods and operations, as well as a chance to familiarize himself with the particulars of our accounts and investments, there will be no meeting of either the Finance Committee or the Administrative Board in July. Both entities will resume their regular meeting schedules in August.

In the interim, Pastor Bill and the Bethany staff will work together to gather and discuss pertinent information in preparation for any needed budgetary adjusting when we officially convene again in two months.

The long-awaited church debit card is now in hand and has been put to use once already. The benefit of having the card lies chiefly in its transactional (and trackable) ease of use for relatively small or routine purchases. The card is attached to a separate account that has a per-event spending limit, and we have given individual signature authority to four members of our church leadership to draw on it for approved church-related purchases only, up to that limit.

Lay Leader's Report

The Milton Cluster of United Methodist Churches held a joint prayer service at Bethany on May 17, with Pastor Damien, Pastor Bob Rice of the West Milton Charge, and Pastor Dale Hippensteel of St. Andrew's presiding. The service was held in conjunction with the Conference's recent week of prayer for the health and future of the Methodist denomination as it faces many challenges an uncertain future and potentially divisive issues, particularly over matters of sexual orientation vis-à-vis the ministry and unity of the greater church.

Those of us who attended the May 25 Ascension Day service at the Parsonage were spiritually uplifted by the included ceremony of releasing lanterns into the dusky sky to mark and celebrate the taking up of Jesus into heaven at the end of His earthly ministry. There is a special poignancy and an almost inexpressible feeling of personal joy and hope that comes with a participatory event like that.

Gideon International representative Anthony Kidd visited both of our services on Sunday, May 28 to speak to our congregations about people around the world whose lives have been profoundly changed because of the Society's placements of the word of God within their reach. The stories of man and Bible meeting for the first time were especially inspiring.

Treasurer Donna Riccio and I attended a special open-invitation Sunday afternoon service on June 4 that brought together clergy, support staff, members, friends, and guests of several local Lutheran churches and St. Joseph Catholic to observe the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. The service was held at Trinity Lutheran in Milton, with Father John Hoke of St. Joseph and the Reverends Fladland of Trinity, Glasoe of Follmer, and Middernacht of Christ Evangelical Lutheran presiding. Attendance was easily 200 people. The tenor of this beautiful service was ecumenical in nature and generally reconciliatory.




