
Spring is a time for renewal and new growth. With your prayers and support, it is also a perfect time to think about what you can do for the Church as we continue our transition process. Thank you for your support!

WHO IS OUR MODERATOR, WHY DO WE HAVE ONE, WHAT DOES THE MODERATOR DO?

Our Moderator is the Reverend Edmund T. Freeborn. He has been with us since the fall of 2016. But what does he do and why is he "our" moderator.



Session meetings are normally moderated by a called and installed pastor with the minutes being recorded by a Clerk of Session. The installed pastor, serving as moderator, presides over the Session as "first among equals" and must be present for all Session motions, votes and decisions.

When a congregation does not have an installed pastor, as is the case here at SPC, the Presbytery appoints a minister member or elected member of the presbytery as moderator with the concurrence of the local church session. This

presence of the appointed moderator provides guidance to Session as it meets to discuss the many issues that need to be handled in the life of the church and the ability to make decisions.

Our moderator also works with and guides the PNC in their efforts, providing additional assistance that is instrumental to the smooth transition to our next chapter in the life of SPC.

Beyond the administrative guidance that the moderator provides, our moderator has also offered himself to us for additional pastoral care responsibilities. He has visited members when possible to offer comfort and has performed such services as occur in the life of a church and its members. We are thankful that our moderator has been so involved with and supportive of Shawnee Presbyterian Church.

Currently serving as the Pastor at East Stroudsburg Presbyterian Church, our moderator, Rev. Freeborn, is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and has been a Presbyterian minister for over 40 years, serving congregations in Iowa, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York and Virginia.

After serving a Presbyterian congregation in upstate New York for 17 years, and immediately prior to coming to the East Stroudsburg Presbyterian Church, Rev. Freeborn served Gloria Dei Lutheran Church and School, a large, military family oriented parish in Hampton, Virginia, for eight years as Executive Associate Pastor and Associate Headmaster. He is committed to ecumenical relationships and interfaith dialogue while maintaining his core Presbyterian beliefs.

Rev. Freeborn graduated from Westminster College, New Wilmington, Pa with a Bachelor of Arts degree from the department of religion and philosophy and from the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa with the Master of Divinity degree. He completed all courses for the doctor of ministry degree at Drew University, Madison, New Jersey, but through that process discovered his love for pastoral counseling and clinical supervision. He completed clinical certification and is a Diplomate in Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy of the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy.

He has supervised the training of clergy and religious professionals in hospitals and parishes in New York and Virginia. He is Clinical Supervisor of the Wycliffe Institute of Pastoral Care in Virginia Beach, Virginia, making use of internet technology to train clergy.

Rev. Freeborn does extensive pastoral care and counseling at East Stroudsburg
Presbyterian Church, and within the East
Stroudsburg University and local
community. Leading his church's campus
ministry mission, Rev. Freeborn is regularly

and serves the larger church in numerous
capacities and often provides counsel and
support to clergy as a "friend in ministry

The hostel is a fundraiser where we charge groups to stay in our CE building in conjunction with Shawnee Ski Mountain. The group sales department at the mountain does all the paperwork and gets the groups. The groups are mostly Boy Scout troops, though we sometimes get cub scouts or church youth groups. Barbara Ross, Chair of The Hostel Committee, reports that winter 2016/2017 was a great season!

In preparation for this season, members and friends of the congregation spent many hours cleaning the CE building. In addition, the bathrooms were given a makeover, including new sinks and faucets. We thank Michelle and Dan Siptroth and Barbara Ross for the donation and installation of the new sinks and faucets.



There were 13 groups who stayed from January 7 through March 12. Every weekend there was a group and on three different weekends we had two different groups!

We have "Hostel Hosts" for each group who greet each group when they arrive, show them around and then are on call in case something happens. This year's greeters were Michelle Siptroth, Steve Clemmons, Pete Ferguson, Chris McClosky, Linda Jennings, Lee Bower, Mike Sodano and Barb Ross. Thank you to each of them for helping out and making this fundraiser run very smoothly. Pete also was a big help in the billing department and making sure the propane was always full.


A total of \$6700 was raised for the church!

UPDATE FROM BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

There are a multitude of projects that have been identified and prioritized for attention regarding all of our facilities. Here is an overview of some of these projects.

With the search for a new Pastor underway, the Manse has been targeted for major projects in the first half of 2017. Removal of the trees and bushes from

around the Manse late last year revealed several areas of concern. These included the siding, the porch and front steps. Additionally, we noted



The exterior aluminum siding will probably have to be repainted rather than cleaned. We are working on solutions for this. Lastly, the front porch will be scraped and painted, the front steps will be removed with a new railing put in their place. We will be planting a ground cover



along the hillside in front of the manse to eliminate the need for cutting grass on the slope, thereby eliminating the potential for accidents or gouging of the hillside.

With the Manse currently unoccupied, we chose to maintain a minimum temperature of around 50 degrees to protect the interior plaster walls from potential freeze/thaw damage. A Temperature/Water alarm was

placed in the front window so that, as happened on February 1st, if the heat falls below 40 degrees the alarm's warning light will blink to make us aware of the problem so corrective action could be taken.

Thanks to the efforts of Steve Clemmons last year, the garage is newly painted and has since been cleaned out. Currently it is being

> used for storage of items to be removed during spring cleanup. Signs, Snow Blower and Generator for the CE building are also currently being stored in the garage.

Behind the manse is a shed which we plan to paint white to match the

manse and garage. We look forward to having this project completed by members of the congregation, just like was done with the garage, to help keep our costs down. The shed is currently being used to store additional Rummage Sale items and Sign committee equipment.

As for the church itself, we have been meeting with various engineers and contractors to identify a cost effective and permanent solution to the crack. We are also planning on repainting the steeple, window frame, trim and doors this year as well as repairing the weather vane at the top of the steeple.

Thanks to the newly recognized historical status, we are now able to apply for grants that we previously were not eligible for. While we don't know what, if any grants we will be awarded, knowing that there is the possibility gives us additional encouragement.

The Monroe County Historical Association accepts nominations each year for Annual Historic Preservation Awards. The historical association presents three Historic Preservation Awards to business and/or individual owners of historic buildings who have shown their dedication to preserving and enhancing Monroe County's wealth of historic structures.

The three categories to be judged are: private residence, non-profit 501(c)3 organization/publicly-funded, and commercial properties. The Monroe County Historical Association recognizes property owners that have continued upkeep, rehabilitated and/or restored their structures in a manner that preserves and respects the historical character of those buildings.

In addition serving local churches, Dr. Kenyon has been president of both the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Baptist Conventions, President of the National Home Missions Society, Chairman of the Board of the Senior Sisco Village, and Chairman of the Wayne Clergy Fellowship. He has taught at Toalc, a community outreach program of East Stroudsburg University, for the last 15 years with, typically with more than 50 students in the class.

Traveling to more than 51 countries, he has led tours to Israel, Greece, and Turkey. Dr. Kenyon and his wife, Elizabeth currently reside in Dingmans Ferry, PA. They have been married for 63 years and have three children and six grandchildren.
