Super Bowl Thoughts and Season Recap

The Super Bowl year in and year out is the most watched, hyped, analyzed, scrutinized and wagered event in the U.S. It's the game where gambling goes from being a sort of "taboo" among the general public to something tens of millions will partake in.

Because everyone wants to have a little "extra" something on the big game whether it be Super Bowl squares, side or total or the more than 1,000 Super Bowl prop plays, demand is at an all-time high for handicappers to deliver their customers winners on the big game. As for us, we usually don't find value in the Super Bowl side or total as there is so much more value on a weekly basis during the regular season when there is 60+ games to choose from in college and the NFL combined. If you disagree with us and think there is a lot of value on the Super Bowl, look no further than the graph on the bottom right of this page. The Vegas books have shown a profit in 33 of the last 35 Super Bowls.

We feel there is much more value in the props market in the Super Bowl and that's why we give out a half-dozen or more prop bets every year to VIP customers. As for this newsletter, we did power rate this game at Seattle by 3 so we do lean with New England +4.5.

Win or lose, we would rather you judge us on the entire season where the VIP football best bets (including bowls and playoffs) have gone 84-63-1 (57.1%). That's the third time in the last four seasons we have been above 57% for the entire season with our VIP selections. All-time we are now above 55% the last 11 years with our newsletter and VIP best bets.

Obviously we couldn't have had a successful last eleven years without your support and patronage. Again, we can't thank you enough that you took a chance on us and for that we'll be forever grateful.

As far as the future goes, we are betting more and more each season and that will continue to get added focus. However, we will still be offering a VIP email and telegram service next season for \$499. Super Bowl Betting Notes (Reported By ESPN)

-Last year, Nevada sports books won \$22.1 million on a \$151.6 million handle. It was the biggest win ever even with sports betting now legalized in nearly 40 states.

-The books have posted a profit in 33 of the past 35 Super Bowls (see below).

-Since Nevada Gaming Control began tracking betting action on the Super Bowl in 1991, the books are up \$266.5 million. Their only losses came in 2008, when the New York Giants upset the Patriots, and in 1995, when the San Francisco 49ers routed the San Diego Chargers (see chart below).

-According to a report released by the American Gaming Association (AGA), Legal American sportsbooks could take an estimated \$1.76 billion in bets for Super Bowl 60. The number represents a nearly 27% year-over-year increase and would be a record for the Super Bowl.

-On August 25th at Circa Sports, a bettor place a \$100 wager on a long-shot Super Bowl exacta with the Patriots defeating the Seahawks. The odds were 3,100/1 meaning he could win \$310,000.

Biggest Super Bowl 60 bets so far:

- \$2 Million on the AFC to win Super Bowl 60 at 2/1 odds two weeks ago at Caesars Sportsbook before the AFC and NFC Championship games.
- \$1.1 Million on New England ML at +188 at Circa Sports.
- \$725,000 on New England ML at +195. Bet would win over \$1.4M and is a hedge from same bettor who wagered \$50K on Seattle to win the Super Bowl at 60/1 odds in the preseason.

SUPER BOWL 60 KEY ATS STATS

1. The team with better win percentage is 1-17 ATS in the Super Bowl since 2008 (Patriots 85% win percentage vs Seahawks 84% this year).
2. The underdog in the Super Bowl is on a 17-6-1 ATS run.
3. The straight up winner of the Super Bowl is 50-7-2 ATS.

Seattle 24 New England 21. Obviously, this is a rematch of Super Bowl 49 which saw New England win 28-24 in dramatic fashion with Malcolm Butler intercepting Russell Wilson's pass in the end zone with 20 seconds left. This is Seattle's first Super Bowl appearance since that game while New England is making their first appearance since 2019. Both teams were long-shots to win the Super Bowl in the preseason. Seattle was around 60/1 and New England 80/1. The winner will become the 2nd biggest long-shot to win the Super Bowl behind only the 1999 Rams who were 150/1.

We've been writing about how some metrics view Seattle as an all-time great team. Right now in DVOA, they are behind only the 1991 Washington Redskins, 1985 Chicago Bears, 2007 New England Patriots and 1989 San Francisco 49ers. We don't view them in that high regard and remember they closed only -2.5 at home vs the Rams in the NFC Championship game. They allowed 8.3 yards per play in the game and probably should have lost outright.

On the other side, New England greatly benefited from playing the weakest schedule in the NFL. After a slow start that included home losses to Las Vegas and Pittsburgh, the Patriots actually rank No. 2 in weighted DVOA which puts more emphasis on more recent games. Obviously, the storyline here is the health status of New England QB Drake Maye. In the regular season, Maye ranked No. 1 in QBR, QB Rating and EPA. However, Maye has struggled in the post-season completing only 55.8% of his passes (72% in regular season). Maye has been dealing with a shoulder injury but stated on media day that the shoulder "turned a corner" and he has no concern for Sunday. If you have a strong opinion on the injury (you think he is far less than 100% or you think he can return to regular season form) that is where you will be building your portfolio on the game. We think Maye plays and we think he will be better than what he showed vs Denver.

The underdog has gone 17-6-1 in the last 24 Super Bowls. This is one of the larger spreads in the Super Bowl in the last 15 years. We think Seattle is the better team and played the tougher schedule but we can't get to this big of a spread. As far as the total, the two teams are a combined 23-16 to the OVER this year but we don't see much value.

Lean New England (+4.5) over Seattle. No opinion on total right now.
