#### April Health Tip

IBS (irritable bowel syndrome) is a disorder characterized by abdominal pain or discomfort and altered bowel habit (chronic or recurrent diarrhea, constipation, or both – either mixed or in alternation)

- 10-15% of the population worldwide suffer from IBS.
- Approximately 20-40% of all visits to gastroenterologists are due to IBS
- symptoms.
- IBS is the most common functional gastrointestinal (GI) disorder.
- Symptoms include abdominal pain when associated with changes in bowel
- habits.
- Four common food/drink offenders are caffeine, chocolate, fiber, and nuts.
- Keeping a diary of symptoms may speed diagnosis when talking with your PCP.


