• Bill Dolph and Mike Sodano are moving ahead with the "Foundation project". This project will shear up the foundation of the pulpit area of the church so that the crack doesn't widen and the building does not sink any further. This has consisted of hours of time dealing with a lawyer and finding out what we have to do so that we do not disturb the bodies that are buried under the church. We will be discussing this with the congregation in the near future.
