BE IT REMEMBERED that upon the hearing of this cause, on April 27th, 2017, before the Honorable Robert C. Winkler, a said judge of the said court, the following proceedings were had, to wit:

6	DIRECT EXAMINATION
7	BY MR. PARKER:
8	Q. Ma'am, can you tell the judge your
9	name?
10	A. Christine Doyle.
11	Q. And you live in the city of
12	Madeira?
13	A. I do.
14	Q. Do you have a position with the
15	City of Madeira government?
16	A. Yes. I'm the Clerk of Council.
17	Q. Who do you report to?
18	A. I report directly to the council
19	itself.
20	THE COURT: Can I ask you a
21	question? Are you elected or are you
22	appointed by the council, ma'am?
23	THE WITNESS: Appointed.
24	THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead.
25	Q. Do you have authority to appoint an

acting clerk? 1 2 Α. No. 3 Q. Is there any procedure for the 4 appointment of an acting clerk in the City of 5 Madeira? Not that I'm aware of. 6 7 Q. Explain why your signature is 8 affixed on ordinances of resolutions as the 9 Clerk of Council. What's the reason for that? 10 The reason is to verify that the 11 document is what was approved by council. 12 And you have to be in attendance at Q. that meeting to know what happened? 13 14 I have to know that it was what was Α. 15 approved by council. 16 Okay. By way of background, are 0. 17 you familiar with particular ordinances by number? If I were to reference an ordinance 18 19 number, would that refresh your recollection 20 about an ordinance? 21 Starting in the 17s, yes. Α. 22 Okay. Good. 0. 17-02, do you 23 remember that ordinance? 24 Α. T do.

PARKER: May I approach the 14 witness, Judge? 15 THE COURT: Yeah. 16 This might refresh your Q. 17 recollection. 18 This was the one that was passed 19 first, which I believe was on the last -- was it 20 February 27th? 21 Well, it should say on there. Q. 22 Yeah. Okay. You say February 27th? 23 Yes, February 27th. Α. 24 Q. Do you remember Ordinance No. 25 17-03?

Α. 9 What is that? Ordinance 17-04? 0. 10 That is the one that creates the 11 Board of Zoning Appeals. 12 And how many readings were there of Q. that ordinance? 13 14 Α. There was one. 15 What was the date that it was Q. 16 passed? 17 That was also March 2nd. Α. 18 Was that passed as an emergency? Q. 19 Α. Yes. 20 Does it contain in the language in Q. the ordinance itself that it was an emergency? 21 22 Not that I'm aware of. Do you recognize 10 that document? 11 This was mailed to the Α. 12 citizens of Madeira regarding the charter 13 amendments. 14 Okay. That was mailed to them? Q. 15 Yes. Α. 16 Did you mail them? Q. 17 I did not put them in the mail. Α. 18 MR. PARKER: Okay. Can I approach 19 the witness, Judge? 20 THE COURT: Yes. 21 Proposed Ordinance 17-06, do you Q. remember that document? 22 23 Α. Yes. How many readings were there of 24 25 that document?

I have nothing further, Judge. 1 2 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. 3 Any questions, Mr. Fox? 4 MR. FOX: Yes, Your Honor. 5 CROSS-EXAMINATION 6 BY MR. FOX: 7 Ms. Doyle, you testified that Q. 8 17-03, 04 and 06 were passed as emergency 9 ordinances. Are you sure about that? 10 MR. PARKER: Objection, Judge. 11 know that -- well, she's --12 THE COURT: I'm going to overrule 13 I mean -- yeah. Okay. Maybe she 14 has residual doubt, but I'll go ahead and 15 let her answer it. 16 Do you remember the question, 17 ma'am? 18 THE WITNESS: I do. 19 THE COURT: Are you sure about 20 that? 21 Quite frankly, no. Α. 22 Q. And why wouldn't you be sure? How 23 long have you been with the City as the clerk? 24 Since February 13th of this year. Α. 25 Okay. So not a long time, correct? Q.

1 Α. Correct. Okay. And in your time as the 2 clerk, have you committed yourself to exhaustive 3 examination and study of the City charter? 4 5 I have read the City charter, it Α. has not been exhaustive. 6 7 Okay. And you do sign documents Q. for the City, correct? 8 9 Α. Correct. 10 Q. Okay. And part of that is that you 11 will affix your signature as a component of 12 certifying an ordinance, correct? 13 Correct. Α. 14 Okay. And why is that done? Q. 15 It is to verify that the document Α. 16 is what was approved by council. 17 Okay. And is there any -- to your 0. 18 knowledge, is there any specific requirement 19 about certification in the charter? 20 There are for some purposes --Α. 21 For some --Q. 22 -- but not for ordinances. Α. 23 Okay. In what circumstances would Q. 24 it be required that you certify a document? 25 If an elector would come up with an Α.

initiative to have something become a law, they would need to present that to me and I would need to certify that. That's also the case for referendums.

And then in the case of a tax levy, I would need to certify something to take to the electors, or to the election officials.

MR. FOX: Okay. And I want to show you a demonstrative. And we can maybe talk through each of those sections and inform the court.

THE COURT: And if the attorneys want -- if they want to look, or move around, you can move around the room.

MR. STEVENSON: That's what I'm going to do. Because I think we can put it someplace over here where --

THE COURT: Just so --

MR. STEVENSON: Can you see it?

THE COURT: No. Why don't you turn it. You can sit in the jury box if you like. Is that -- Mr. Stevenson, if you want to sit --

MR. STEVENSON: Yeah, that would be fine.

THE COURT: It's up to you, if you want to move. Mr. Parker, if you want to move, you can move, move around the room.

BY MR. FOX:

- Q. Okay. And your testimony a little bit ago was there were three circumstances in which a certification is required. And I'm displaying for the court Madeira Charter, Article XII, Section 2 B that relates to one of the three processes. And looking at that language, does that relate to an initiative petition?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. And what is your understanding of an initiative petition?
- A. My understanding is that that is when a person, or a citizen, decides to circulate a petition to have something become a law.
- Q. And you would acknowledge that there is some form of certification requirement included in that section?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. I'm going to show you this next section, Article XII, Section 3 E. And this

section relates to referendum. And what would you describe -- in your understanding, what is a referendum?

- A. Referendum would be when council passes something as a law, and again, someone, a citizen, could circulate a petition to stop that from being a law.
- Q. Okay. And in that section you see plenty of mentions of the word certified or certification, correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. And one of the provisions says a certified copy should be obtained by petitioner from the clerk, correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. So, in looking at that section, you see an affirmative obligation there as well, right?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. And this is the -- I believe the third section that you referenced, which relates to levies, tax levies. This is Article X, Section 2. And looking at the highlighted section there, you see -- can you read that?
 - A. Such resolution shall take effect

upon its adoption and shall be certified by the 1 Clerk forthwith to the election authorities who 2 3 shall place said question upon the ballot. 4 Okay. So three clear affirmative Q. 5 obligations upon the clerk to do some action, 6 correct? 7 Α. Correct. 8 Okay. The section that relates to Q. 9 amending the charter is Article XIV, would you 10 agree with that? 11 Α. Yes. 12 Q. Okay. And is there an affirmative certification requirement for purposes of 13 14 amending the charter? 15 Α. Yes. 16 Okay. And when does the language Q. 17 of that charter provision require a 18 certification to take place? 19 After it has been --Α. 20 MR. PARKER: Objection. Asking the 21 witness to draw a legal conclusion. If 22 the law is what it is, then you don't 23 need to have her tell us what it is. If 24 it's in the charter, it's --25 THE COURT: If you want her to,

1 I'll just have her read it to me, and 2 I'll just conclude myself. I mean, I'm 3 looking at it. It's overruled. 4 And could you read that section of Q. 5 the charter for the court? 6 Α. The highlighted part or the whole 7 thing? 8 You can read the whole thing. Q. 9 Okay. If any such charter Α. 10 amendment is approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon, it shall become a part 11 of this charter. A copy of any approved charter 12 13 amendment must be certified by the Clerk to the Secretary of State within 30 days after 14 15 adoption. 16 And could you -- what is the second 0. 17 to the last word there? 18 That would be after. Α. 19 Q. Okay. So after its adoption by the 20 voters, correct? 21 Α. Correct. 22 Okay. And reviewing your role Q. within the City of Madeira --23 24 Opposing counsel, can you sit down, 25 sir?

1 THE COURT: He can stand. 2 MR. FOX: He can stand? Well, I'm 3 just not sure if he's going to interject 4 here in my --5 THE COURT: Oh, you're going to use 6 that exhibit? 7 MR. FOX: I'm done using that. 8 Yeah. Thanks, Your Honor. 9 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. 10 I'll even take it down. MR. FOX: 11 BY MR. FOX: 12 Q. So in reviewing your role, they 13 made a great deal of questioning about certification of ordinances. Do you know of any 14 15 other affirmative obligation upon you, the clerk, to certify ordinances other than those 16 17 that we've just discussed? 18 Α. Not per the charter. 19 Q. Okay. One of your roles is that --20 well, you -- one of your roles is signing documents. What's another role that you have 21 22 within the City? 23 I take the minutes for the council Α. 24 meetings. 25 Okay. And how do you compose the Q.

minutes? Or how do you prepare the minutes? 1 2 I attend the council meetings. 3 I have a laptop there that I take notes as things happen. Then I listen to the audio tape, 4 often more than once, to fill in any blanks and 5 6 get all the details correct. 7 Okay. And was there an audio Q. 8 recording of the meeting that took place on 9 February 27th? 10 Α. Yes. 11 Okay. Was there an audio recording Q. of the meetings that took place on March the 12 13 3rd? 14 Α. Yes. 15 What about an audio recording of Q. 16 the meeting that took place on March the 13th? 17 Α. Yes. 18 Q. Okay. So there were audio recordings of all of those meetings? 19 20 Α. Correct. 21 Q. Okay. Is there any -- to your 22 knowledge -- any affirmative obligation or 23 requirement upon you to attend a meeting in 24 order to prepare minutes? 25

1 Q. Would it be fair to say that you 2 could listen to a recording in order to 3 determine whether something actually took place? 4 Α. Yes. 5 would it also be fair to say that Q. if somebody else within your office attended a 6 7 meeting, that you could rely upon what they 8 represented to have taken place? 9 Yes. Α. 10 Okay. And were you in attendance Q. 11 at the early March special meeting, March 3rd 12 meeting? 13 Α. Yes. 14 Okay. And did you personally Q. 15 witness with your own eyes council dispensing of the three-reading requirement? 16 17 Α. Yes. 18 Q. So you observed that they debated and discussed the ordinances, and then following 19 up with that, that they voted to dispense with 20 21 the three-reading requirement? 22 Α. Yes. 23 MR. FOX: Okay. Nothing further. 24 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Goodin, any 25 questions? Mr. Stevenson, I assume you

1	don't have any questions, do you, sir?
2	Or do you?
3	MR. STEVENSON: I've got nothing.
4	THE COURT: All right. Mr. Parker,
5	anything further, sir?
