Meeting of the DeKalb County Commission

Presiding Commissioner, Harold Allison, East District Commissioner, Garry McFee, West District Commissioner Kyle White and County Clerk, Clerk Melissa Meek.

Presiding Commissioner, Harold Allison led all in attendance in prayer with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Office holders, employees as well as Sharon and Steve Smith of Osborn attended the prayer and pledge this Monday morning.

The Commission welcomes any and all to the openings of their Commission meetings.

East District Commissioner, Garry McFee made the motion to accept the agenda as presented with West District Commissioner, Kyle White making the second. Motion carried. West District Commissioner, Kyle White to approve the minutes for the July 23rd meeting with East District Commissioner, Garry McFee making the second. Motion carried.

Dallas Township Board Member, David Brown met with the Commission to discuss Liberty Road, brush clearance as well as Santa Rosa Road.

A patron from Sherman Township met with the Commission to discuss a ditch on his property.

John Murphy met with the Commission and asked how much rock is being applied to County roads.

West District Commissioner, Kyle White has meetings in Washington Township and Tri-County Health this week. East District Commissioner, Garry McFee has Colfax Township meeting as well as a CCAM meeting in Eminence. Garry serves on the Board for CCAM (County Commissioner Association of Missouri)

Road & Bridge Supervisor Bill Gray met with the Commission to discuss projects they were working on and projects for the future.

The Commission did a telephone conference with a patron of the County disputing his taxes that were due. The patron agreed to pay the taxes due by the deadline that was set forth by the Collector.

Ben Alldridge of Murphy Tractor delivered the skid steer to the road & bridge department.

The Commission approved accounts payable and payroll.

Rip Anderson of Metal Culverts called to say he had been sick and had had a death in the family. The Commission sends their prayers and sympathies to him and his family.

The Commission continues talks concerning the Law Enforcement Sales Tax and the position of Prosecutor. Both of these issues will be on the ballot in the August primary. The question for prosecutor will be for the public to vote on the position being full time. The Sales Tax will be a question for the public and the money will be used for various funds that the tax applies too such as the Sheriff's office, Prosecuting Attorney's office, Victims Advocate and the Coroner. There have been conversations with several of the schools in the County concerning the need for resource officers. The officers would be funded partially by the County and the Schools if all are agreeable. The issues will be 2 separate ballot questions. These issues were brought to the Commission as needs from the Prosecuting Attorney and the Sheriff.

County Clerk, Melissa Meek wanted to remind everyone that there will be no electioneering on County property or within 25' of any precinct on election day. She also wants to remind everyone the sale of Eldon and Janice Taylor (Taylor Chevrolet) will be August 3rd and August 4th. The west side of the square will be blocked off in the early morning hours of the 3rd so they can get the sale set up. They are expecting a huge crowd and with absentee voting going on the morning of the 4th a guard will be in place of the basement in Courthouse during voting hours which are 8 until noon. She also reminded them that training for her pollworkers would be on Monday August 6th with the poll workers picking up their equipment at the Courthouse after training.

East District Commissioner, Garry McFee made the motion to adjourn with West District Commissioner, Kyle White made the second. Motion carried.
